Remarks:

<b>HCR 123</b>	<b>WALKER</b>	<b>INDIAN AFFAIRS:</b> Recognizes the Avoyel-Taensa Tribe/Nation of Louisiana as an Indian tribe of Louisiana
<b>HB 54</b>	<b>CROWE</b>	<b>CRIME/RAPE:</b> Provides for criminal penalties for simple rape
<b>HB 232</b>	<b>FUTRELL</b>	<b>CRIME/SEX OFFENSES:</b> Requires sex offenders to provide a description of their physical characteristics relative to sex offender registration and notification
<b>HB 375</b>	<b>FAUCHEUX</b>	<b>CRIME:</b> Reduces the penalty for second degree murder
<b>HB 376</b>	<b>FAUCHEUX</b>	<b>CRIMINAL/VERDICTS:</b> Provides that "guilty of negligent homicide" may be rendered as a responsive verdict to an indictment which charges the offense of manslaughter
<b>HB 377</b>	<b>FAUCHEUX</b>	<b>CRIMINAL/VERDICTS:</b> Provides for responsive verdicts for the crime of second degree murder
<b>HB 529</b>	<b>FAUCHEUX</b>	<b>CRIME/SEX OFFENSES:</b> Authorizes certain sex offenders to have their convictions set aside or prosecution dismissed
<b>HB 530</b>	<b>FARRAR</b>	<b>LOTTERY:</b> Provides for sales commission for lottery retailers
<b>HB 641</b>	<b>WINSTON</b>	<b>CRIMINAL/BUREAU CRIML ID:</b> Provides child placement agencies and other persons with access to criminal background information
<b>HB 950</b>	<b>WINSTON</b>	<b>JUVENILES:</b> Provides for the maximum length of time for which a deferred dispositional agreement and dispositions can be effective
<b>HB 1105</b>	<b>LANDRIEU</b>	<b>JUVENILES/DELINQUENTS:</b> Authorizes courts with juvenile jurisdiction to utilize or initiate teen court programs
<b>HB 1862</b>	<b>PERKINS</b>	<b>PARDON/PAROLE:</b> Prohibits granting a pardon unless that person has paid all of the fees and fines which were imposed
<b>HB 1891</b>	<b>BALDONE</b>	<b>CRIME/SEX OFFENSES:</b> Provides for an exception to the sex offender registration provisions for those persons pardoned by the governor
<b>HB 1939</b>	<b>LAFLEUR</b>	<b>GAMBLING/VIDEO POKER:</b> Repeals residence and domicile requirements for certain video draw poker licensees
<b>HB 1981</b>	<b>MARTINY</b>	<b>CRIME/SEX OFFENSES:</b> Prohibits certain sexual acts in public
