HB 37	BALDONE	CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES: Provides that drug-free zone sentences shall be served without parole, probation, or suspension of sentence
HB 92	MURRAY	GAMBLING: Authorizes gambling on commercial cruiseships sailing inside continental waters
HB 274	FLAVIN	CRIMINAL/BAIL: Sets the minimum amount of bail for certain offenses
HB 362	MARTINY	CRIMINAL/PROCEDURE: Provides that surety be given a receipt for fees paid in connection with defendant's surrender
HB 410	BALDONE	CRIMINAL/PROCEDURE: Provides for corporate criminal liability in felony cases
HB 684	JEFFERSON	CRIMINAL/EXTRADITION: Prohibits the use of bail in extradition cases
HB 719	HUNTER	CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES : Provides for phone usage policies at correctional facilities
HB 872	MARTINY (TBA)	ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Prohibits the possession of alcoholic beverages by persons under the age of 18 (Subject to Rule Suspension)
HB 893	WINSTON (TBA)	EVIDENCE: Provides for the admissibility of electronic recordings (Subject to Rule Suspension)
HB 1418	DEWITT	GAMBLING: Prohibits a monopoly of gaming properties
HB 1486	LAFLEUR	GAMBLING: Authorizes the calling of a local option election for the operation of video draw poker devices in an eligible parish
HB 1559	DAMICO (TBA)	GAMBLING: Amends gambling device provisions to provide that games of skill are not illegal gambling devices (Subject to Rule Suspension)
HB 1570	E ROMERO	GAMBLING: Authorizes the calling of a local option election for the operation of video draw poker devices in Iberia Parish
HB 1571	WINSTON	COURTS: Provides for an administrative deposit to accompany a personal undertaking as bail in certain courts
SB 164	N GAUTREAUX (TBA)	JUVENILES: Provides additional locations where it is unlawful for sexually violent predators and sexual offenders to be present. (Subject to Rule Suspension)
SB 401	MARIONNEAUX	GAMING: Eliminates the 180-day time limit on allowing continued operation of video poker devices for

persons who are already licensed at the time of application.
