<b>HB 18</b>	<b>FARRAR</b>	<b>PRESCRIPTION</b> Provides a two-year liberative prescription period for certain delictual actions
<b>HB 174</b>	<b>BRUNEAU</b>	<b>CIVIL/PROCEDURE</b> Provides for service of process on judgment debtor rules
<b>HB 180</b>	<b>BRUNEAU</b>	<b>CIVIL/PROCEDURE</b> Provides relative to notice of judgments on rules to show cause
<b>HB 218</b>	<b>LAFONTA</b>	<b>HISTORIC PRESERVATION</b> Provides with respect to preservation of buildings and landmarks by removing prescriptive period within which to bring an action to enforce zoning restrictions
<b>HB 221</b>	<b>LAFONTA</b>	<b>PLANNING/ZONING</b> Provides relative to zoning as it affects historic preservation
<b>HB 453</b>	<b>TOOMY</b>	<b>EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS</b> Provides a limitation of liability and license suspension for health care providers during a state of emergency
<b>HB 455</b>	<b>LAFONTA</b>	<b>LIABILITY/CIVIL</b> Limits liability of faith-based organizations acting as shelters and individuals transporting persons to shelters during a natural disaster
<b>HB 570</b>	<b>SCALISE</b>	<b>CIVIL/ACTIONS</b> Authorizes a qui tam action for persons who disclose the improper use of hurricane relief funds
<b>HB 583</b>	<b>FARRAR</b>	<b>INSURANCE/AUTOMOBILE</b> Provides a prescriptive period for any delictual action for damage claims involving motor vehicle insurance or liability bond
<b>HB 727</b>	<b>LAMBERT (TBA)</b>	<b>APPROPRIATIONS</b> (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for separate appropriation bills for the governor, lieutenant governor, and each department of state government and a combined bill for other entities <i>(Technical Review Only)</i> <b>(Subject to Rule Suspension)</b>
<b>HB 809</b>	<b>PITRE</b>	<b>CIVIL/COMMITMENT</b> Provides relative to the custody and transportation of persons suffering from mental illness or substance abuse
<b>HCR 28</b>	<b>SMITH, JOHN</b>	<b>CIVIL/LAW</b> Authorizes the Louisiana State Law Institute to review certain laws regarding usufruct
