

| HCR 46 | LEBAS | VOTERS/VOTING Expresses opposition to federal takeover of local election processes and unfunded mandates for elections and memorializes congress to implement certain requirements if funding is made conditional on adoption of new voting and registration procedures |
| HCR 54 | LAFONTA | VOTING/REGISTRATION Requests the secretary of state to develop a plan to change registration and voting requirements and procedures to allow for same-day voter registration |
| HB 39 | TALBOT | LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS Relative to extraordinary sessions convened by the legislative presiding officers, provides for the procedure and the form of the petition to call such a session and provides relative to the time and duration thereof |
| HB 51 | CHAMPAGNE | ELECTED OFFICIALS/TERMS (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for term limits for certain statewide elected officials |
| HB 59 | FOIL | ELECTION CODE Changes the hours the polls are required to be open on election day |
| HB 62 | ABRAMSON | LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR Prohibits a person appointed to fill a vacancy in the office of lieutenant governor when the unexpired term exceeds one year from being a candidate in the election to fill the remainder of the term |
| HB 101 | HARDY | ELECTED OFFICIALS (Constitutional Amendment) Provides term limits for judges, district attorneys, and sheriffs |
| HB 292 | GREENE | ELECTIONS Provides for an open primary system of elections for congressional offices |
| HB 409 | HARRISON | SCHOOLS/BOARDS Provides term limits for members of city, parish, and other local public school boards |
| HB 410 | CARTER | SCHOOLS/BOARDS Requires local option elections in every school district on term limits for school board members |

HB 434	PUGH	ELECTION CODE Makes revisions to the election code
HB 470	HARDY	ELECTED OFFICIALS (Constitutional Amendment) Prohibits a person 70 years old or older from qualifying for elective office
HB 471	HARDY	VOTING/REGISTRATION Provides for an annual high school voter registration week
HB 625	BARROW	ELECTIONS/RECALL Provides relative to recall elections
HB 627	GALLOT	ELECTIONS/PRECINCTS Provides relative to the prohibition on certain precinct changes during certain time periods
HB 631	SIMON	VOTERS/VOTING Provides relative to assistance in voting
HB 639	HAZEL	ELECTIONS/BALLOTS Specifies certain information which must be on a ballot relative to tax matters
HB 650	EDWARDS	ELECTED OFFICIALS/STATEW Provides that a statewide elected official who takes certain actions seeking another office has ipso facto resigned from office
HB 671	LAFONTA	ELECTIONS/CANDIDATES Provides relative to persons who are seeking elective office and who have been temporarily displaced by an emergency
HB 721	RICHMOND	ELECTIONS/COMMISSIONERS Provides relative to commissioners serving at a polling place on election day
HB 791	RICHMOND (TBA)	PUBLIC RECORDS Provides relative to public records exceptions (Subject to Rule Suspension)
HB 969	PEARSON	SCHOOLS/BOARDS Provides relative to qualifications for election as a member on a school board
HB 1115	LAFONTA	VOTING/REGISTRATION Allows for registration until and upon election day
HB 1157	HENRY	ELECTIONS/CONGRESSIONAL Provides relative to the system for congressional elections
