 HB 54	NEWELL	CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES Provides relative to the regulation of cannabis
 HB 370	ORGERON	ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES Allows any wine producer or manufacturer to sell sparkling and still wine on or off premises and ship directly to a consumer
 HB 380	ZERINGUE	COURTS Provides relative to electronic filings
 HB 496	HORTON	VETERANS Provides relative to compensation for assistance with veterans benefits
 HB 533	WRIGHT	JUDGES/SUPREME COURT (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for the appointment of justices of the supreme court

 SB 227	HODGES	LAW ENFORCEMENT Provides for training requirements for part-time and reserve peace officers. (gov sig)
 SB 402	DUPLESSIS	CRIMINAL PROCEDURE Provides that victims be allowed to directly address a defendant when providing a victim impact statement. (8/1/24)
