_____	SB 141	MORRIS, JAY	COURTS Provides that activities of the Integrated Criminal Justice Information System Policy Board be performed by the Louisiana Supreme Court.
_____	SB 156	KLEINPETER	CRIME/PUNISHMENT Increases the maximum period of imprisonment for negligent homicide.
_____	SB 181	FOIL	CHARITABLE GAMING Provides an exemption for nonprofit healthcare organizations to hold and operate a license for conducting certain raffles.
_____	SB 207	MIGUEZ	CRIMINAL PROCEDURE Provides 10-year time limitation on prosecution of certain crimes committed by elected officials and public employees.
_____	SB 396	CLOUD	JUVENILE JUSTICE Provides that children in custody of the office of juvenile justice may attend review hearings via secure video conference.
