III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 542 by Representative Schroder

Representative Schroder presented House Bill No. 542, which provides relative to required state assessments including prohibiting implementation of Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) and similar assessments.

Representative Carmody offered amendments to House Bill No. 542 that would provide as follows:

- 1. Prohibit the state Department of Education from contracting with the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) consortium for assessments for the 2015-2016 school year and require the department to contract with another vendor, in accordance with the Louisiana Procurement Code, for assessments for grades three through 10 in English language arts and math for the 2015-2016 school year.
- 2. Limit the number of assessment questions that can be based on the blueprint developed through the PARCC process or processes conducted by a federally funded consortium of states.
- 3. Delete <u>proposed law</u> prohibition on implementation of PARCC and Smarter Balanced and other similar assessments. Retain <u>present law</u> requiring that assessments be based on nationally recognized content standards and requiring that student achievement standards be based on national test scores.
- 4. Delete <u>proposed law</u> requirement for a parent's or guardian's approval of administration of an alternate assessment to a student with disabilities.

Representative Carmody offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Broadwater, Carmody, Carter, Hall, Henry, Ivey, Jefferson, Nancy Landry, Price, Reynolds, Shadoin, and Smith voted yea.

Representative Carter offered amendments to make <u>proposed law</u> effective if and when House Bill No. 373 and Senate Bill No. 43 of the 2015 Regular Session become effective. Representative Carter offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments

were adopted by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Broadwater, Carmody, Carter, Edwards, Hall, Ivey, Jefferson, Nancy Landry, Price, Reynolds, Shadoin, and Smith voted yea.
