Minutes of Meeting 2016 Regular Session May 3, 2016

III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 400 by Representative Reynolds

Representative Reynolds presented House Bill No. 400, which provides relative to the review of textbooks and other instructional materials by the state Dept. of Education.

Representative Reynolds offered amendments to House Bill No. 400 that would provide as follows:

- 1. Restore <u>present law</u> provisions authorizing DOE to review textbooks at such times as it deems necessary and appropriate and requiring the review of textbooks in core subject areas at least every six years.
- 2. Add <u>proposed law</u> requirement that DOE conduct reviews in accordance with the state board's schedule of reviews of core state academic content standards, prioritize reviews of textbooks used to teach state academic content standards recently reviewed and revised, and publish a projected review timeline on its website.
- 3. Remove <u>proposed law</u> prohibition against DOE's textbook reviews in more than one core subject area in a given year and <u>proposed law</u> requirement that reviews in core subject areas be conducted over the course of a six-year cycle.

Representative Reynolds offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Nancy Landry, Amedee, Bouie, Broadwater, Steve Carter, Edmonds, Emerson, Falconer, Hall, Leger, Price, Reynolds, Simon, and Smith voted yea.

Erin Bendily, state Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, Claiborne Bldg., 1201 North 3rd St., Baton Rouge, LA, spoke in support of House Bill No. 400.

Representative Reynolds offered a motion to report House Bill No. 400 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 400 was reported with amendments by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Nancy Landry, Amedee, Bouie, Broadwater, Steve Carter, Edmonds, Emerson, Falconer, Hall, Leger, Price, Reynolds, Simon, and Smith voted yea.

Without objection, the motion to adopt the substitute passed by a vote of 13 years and 0 nays. Representatives Nancy Landry, Amedee, Bouie, Steve Carter, Edmonds, Emerson, Falconer, Hall, Leger, Price, Reynolds, Simon, and Smith voted yea.

House Bill No. 964 by Representative Smith

Representative Smith presented House Bill No. 964, which provides relative to the treatment and care of students with diabetes.

Representative Smith offered a motion to report House Bill No. 964 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 964 was reported favorably by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Nancy Landry, Amedee, Bouie, Steve Carter, Edmonds, Emerson, Falconer, Hall, Leger, Price, Reynolds, Simon, and Smith voted yea.

House Bill No. 165 by Representative Pearson

House Bill No. 165, which provides relative to extended sick leave granted to teachers, school bus drivers, and other public school employees in certain instances, was on the meeting agenda but did not receive a hearing by the committee.

House Bill No. 653 by Representative Bagley

House Bill No. 653, which requires an evaluator of a teacher or administrator to conduct a postobservation conference with the teacher administrator after a classroom visit, was on the meeting agenda but did not receive a hearing by the committee.

House Bill No. 462 by Representative Armes

House Bill No. 462, which provides relative to sick leave and extended sick leave for school employees, was on the meeting agenda but did not receive a hearing by the committee.
