III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Concurrent Resolution No. 52 by Representative Thibaut

Representative Thibaut presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 52, which would extend the False River Watershed Council until June 30, 2020.

Representative Danahay offered amendments to change the termination date of the council from June 30, 2020, to January 13, 2020, and to require the council to submit a report to the legislature no later than 30 days prior to the 2018 Regular Session.

Representative Danahay offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gary Carter, Jimmy Harris, Hill, Jenkins, Gregory Miller, Pugh, and Danahay voted yea.

Representative Pugh offered a motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 52 with amendments. Without objection, House Concurrent Resolution No. 52 was reported with amendments by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gary Carter, Jimmy Harris, Hill, Jenkins, Gregory Miller, Pugh, and Danahay voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 99 by Senator Donahue

Representative Danahay presented Senate Bill No. 99, which provides relative to the St. Tammany Parish Development District.

Representative Gregory Miller offered amendments to add a reference to the proposed limitation on public records to the Public Records Law and to make technical changes.

Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gary Carter, Jimmy Harris, Hill, Jenkins, Gregory Miller, Pugh, and Danahay voted yea.

Representative Pugh offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 99 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 99 was reported with amendments by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gary Carter, Jimmy Harris, Hill, Jenkins, Gregory Miller, Pugh, and Danahay voted yea.

House Concurrent Resolution No. 55 by Representative Norton

Representative Norton presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 55, which creates a task force to study Louisiana's current statewide system of healthcare delivery for Medicaid enrollees with serious mental illness.

Representative Jenkins offered a motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 55 favorably. Without objection, House Concurrent Resolution No. 55 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gary Carter, Jimmy Harris, Hill, Jenkins, Gregory Miller, Pugh, and Danahay voted yea.
