III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 887 by Representative Stokes

Representative Stokes presented House Bill No. 887, which prohibits the acceptance of certain campaign contributions by the chairman of the State Bond Commission.

Representative Danahay offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 887. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 887 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Danahay, Gary Carter, Jimmy Harris, Gregory Miller, Jay Morris, Pugh, and Shadoin voted yea.

House Bill No. 810 by Representative Chaney

Representative Chaney presented House Bill No. 810, which provides relative to the members of the board of commissioners of certain hospital service districts.

Representative Shadoin offered a motion to report House Bill No. 810 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 810 was reported favorably by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. House Bill No. 770 by Representative Gregory Miller

House Bill No. 770 provides relative to the special campaign finance reports due within the period beginning twenty days prior to the election.

Representative Danahay offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 770. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 770 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 9 years and 0 nays.

Senate Bill No. 305 by Senator Thompson

Representative Anders presented Senate Bill No. 305, which authorizes the governing authority of certain parishes to appoint members to a hospital service district.

William Rucker, Concordia Parish Hospital Service District, Ferriday, LA, 318-757-6551, spoke for information only on the bill.

Representative Jay Morris offered amendments to remove the specific requirement that the physician appointed shall serve in place of the immediate past chief of staff of the hospital medical staff.

Representative Jay Morris offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Danahay, Gary Carter, Jimmy Harris, Jenkins, Gregory Miller, Jay Morris, Pugh, and Shadoin voted yea.

Representative Jay Morris offered amendments to provide that the designation of the physician as the physician member of the board of commissioners is a designation notwithstanding other provisions of law.

Representative Jay Morris offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Danahay, Gary Carter, Jimmy Harris, Lance Harris, Jenkins, Gregory Miller, Jay Morris, and Pugh voted yea.

Representative Pugh offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 305 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 305 was reported with amendments by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays.
