#### III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

## **House Bill No. 45 by Representative Talbot**

Representative Talbot presented House Bill No. 45, which provides for fines associated with selling tobacco, alternative nicotine, or vapor products to persons under the age of eighteen.

Representative Mack offered an amendment to provide that the increase in present law fines apply only to sellers of vapor products to persons under the age of eighteen. Representative Mack offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 14 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Bacala, Carpenter, Crews, Duplessis, Gaines, Hodges, Howard, James, Marcelle, Marino, Moss, Muscarello, Norton, and Pylant voted yea. Representative Mack abstained.

Representative Norton offered a motion to report House Bill No. 45 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 45 was reported with amendments by a vote of 14 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Bacala, Carpenter, Crews, Duplessis, Gaines, Hodges, Howard, James, Marcelle, Marino, Moss, Muscarello, Norton, and Pylant voted yea. Representative Mack abstained.

Representative Marcelle offered a motion to report House Bill No. 215 favorably, to which Representative Mack objected. The secretary called the roll, and House Bill No. 215 was reported favorably by a vote of 8 yeas and 7 nays. Representatives Bagneris, Carpenter, Duplessis, Gaines, James, Marcelle, Marino, and Norton voted yea. Representatives Mack, Bacala, Crews, Hodges, Howard, Muscarello, and Pylant voted nay.

# House Concurrent Resolution No. 45 by Representative Hoffmann

Representative Hoffmann presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 45, which requests the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections to study laws and policies relative to benefits, including sick leave, for teachers at facilities under the jurisdiction of the office of juvenile justice who are injured or disabled as a result of assault or battery while acting in their official capacity.

Representative Norton offered a motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 45 favorably. Without objection, House Concurrent Resolution No. 45 was reported favorably by a vote of 9 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Bacala, Bagneris, Carpenter, Crews, Duplessis, Howard, Muscarello, Norton, and Pylant voted yea. Representative Mack abstained.

## House Bill No. 270 by Representative Amedee

Representative Amedee presented House Bill No. 270, which requires proof of private ownership of immovable property when criminal trespass is upon a river, stream, lake, or other waterway.

Representative Bacala offered a motion to report House Bill No. 270 favorably.

Representative James offered a substitute motion to involuntarily defer action on House Bill No. 270, to which Representative Crews objected. The secretary called the roll, and action on House Bill No. 270 was involuntarily deferred by a vote of 7 yeas, 4 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Bagneris, Carpenter, Duplessis, James, Marcelle, Marino, and Norton voted yea. Representatives Bacala, Crews, Howard, and Pylant voted nay. Representative Mack abstained.

# **House Bill No. 59 by Representative Marcelle**

Representative Marcelle presented House Bill No. 59, which provides relative to penalties for possession of marijuana.

Representative Marcelle offered amendments as follows:

- (1) For first convictions, when the offender possesses fourteen grams or less of marijuana, provide that the offender shall be fined not more than \$300 or sentenced to not more than forty-eight hours of court-approved community service.
- (2) For other first convictions of possession of marijuana, in addition to the fines or terms of imprisonment, provide that the court may sentence the offender to perform not more than forty-eight hours of court-approved community service.

Representative Marcelle offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Bacala, Bagneris, Carpenter, Crews, Duplessis, Howard, James, Marcelle, Marino, Norton, and Pylant voted yea. Representative Mack abstained.

Representative Norton offered a motion to report House Bill No. 59 with amendments, to which Representative Bacala objected. The secretary called the roll, and House Bill No. 59 was reported with amendments by a vote of 7 yeas and 5 nays. Representatives Bagneris, Carpenter, Duplessis, Gaines, James, Marcelle, and Norton voted yea. Representatives Bacala, Crews, Howard, Marino, and Pylant voted nay.

Witness cards submitted by individuals who did not speak are as follows: 22 in support and 4 in opposition. Witness cards are included in the committee records.

## **House Bill No. 509 by Representative Bagneris**

Representative Bagneris offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 509, which provides relative to marijuana. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 509 was voluntarily

deferred by a vote of 12 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Bacala, Bagneris, Carpenter, Crews, Duplessis, Gaines, Howard, James, Marcelle, Marino, Norton, and Pylant voted yea. Representative Mack abstained.

# **House Bill No. 267 by Representative Norton**

Representative Norton presented House Bill No. 267, which authorizes the establishment of arts-based programming at juvenile detention facilities.

Representative Bacala offered a motion to report House Bill No. 267 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 267 was reported favorably by a vote of 9 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Bacala, Carpenter, Crews, Gaines, Howard, James, Marcelle, Norton, and Pylant voted yea. Representative Mack abstained.

# **House Bill No. 71 by Representative Mack**

Representative Mack offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 71, which provides relative to the accreditation bodies for laboratories used in certain post-conviction relief proceedings. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 71 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 9 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Bacala, Carpenter, Crews, Gaines, Howard, James, Marcelle, Norton, and Pylant voted yea. Representative Mack abstained.

# House Bill No. 140 by Representative Hodges

On behalf of Representative Hodges, Representative Mack offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 140, which creates the crime of terrorizing of a judge or law enforcement officer. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 140 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 9 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Bacala, Carpenter, Crews, Gaines, Howard, James, Marcelle, Norton, and Pylant voted yea. Representative Mack abstained.
