III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 843 by Representative Schexnayder

On behalf of Representative Schexnayder, Representative Turner presented House Bill No. 843, which provides for the regulation of industrial hemp, industrial hemp products, and industrial hemp-derived cannabidiol (CBD) products.

Commissioner Mike Strain, Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry, 5825 Florida Blvd., Baton Rouge, LA 70806, (225) 922-1234, spoke for information only on House Bill No. 843.

Representative Thompson offered amendments to:

- 1. Remove proposed law introductory language contained in the provision creating the Industrial Hemp Advisory Committee relevant to industry background information and a summary of powers and duties granted to the regulatory agencies under Part V and Part VI of present law.
- 2. Remove the proposed law authorizations granted to the Industrial Hemp Advisory Committee enabling the committee to receive and study information and make recommendations for future legislation relative to the following: (a) the sustainability of the industrial hemp industry; (b) industrial hemp-derived CBD products not approved for sale in the state; and (c) labeling requirements of all industrial hemp-derived CBD products.
- 3. Add a provision that authorizes the Industrial Hemp Advisory Committee to receive and review information and requests and make recommendations for future legislation relative to the regulation of industrial hemp, industrial hemp products, and industrial hemp-derived CBD products.
- 4. Make technical changes

Representative Thompson offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 15 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives McFarland, Bourriaque, Bryant, Butler, Deshotel, Travis Johnson, McCormick, McMahen, Mincey, Riser, Romero, St. Blanc, Thompson, Turner, and Wheat voted yea.

Representative Thompson offered a motion to report House Bill No. 843 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 843 was reported with amendments by a vote of 17 yeas and 0 nays.
