## III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

# Senate Bill No. 21 by Senator Hewitt

Senator Hewitt presented Senate Bill No. 21, which provides for revisions to the fee structure and oversight of the in-service training and educational programs for state employees by the Department of State Civil Service.

Byron Decoteau, Jr., State Civil Service, no address provided, (225) 342-8272, spoke for information only on Senate Bill No. 21.

Representative Mike Johnson offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 21 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 21 was reported favorably by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Beaullieu, Duplessis, Farnum, Gadberry, Henry, Hodges, Horton, Ivey, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Magee, Newell, Schamerhorn, and White voted yea.

# Senate Bill No. 20 by Senator Hewitt

Senator Hewitt presented Senate Bill No. 20, which provides relative to voting and the holding of elections impaired as the result of a declared emergency or disaster.

Representative Ivey offered a motion to involuntarily defer action on Senate Bill No. 20.

Representative Ivey offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on Senate Bill No. 20. Without objection, action on Senate Bill No. 20 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 14 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Duplessis, Farnum, Gadberry, Henry, Hodges, Horton, Ivey, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Magee, Newell, Schamerhorn, and White voted yea. Representative Dwight abstained.

## Senate Bill No. 22 by Senator Hewitt

Senator Hewitt presented Senate Bill No. 22, which provides for preparation and counting of absentee and early voting ballots.

Representative Dwight offered amendments to:

- (1) Limit changes to procedures and compensation of parish board of election supervisors to elections impaired as a result of a declared disaster or emergency.
- Provide that the procedures granting additional time that may begin four days before an election impaired as a result of a declared disaster or emergency for the preparation and verification of absentee by mail and early voting ballots are void and of no effect on August 1, 2021.

Representative Dwight offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 14 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Duplessis, Farnum, Gadberry, Henry, Hodges, Horton, Ivey, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Magee, Newell, Schamerhorn, and White voted yea. Representative Dwight abstained.

Lani Durio, office of the Louisiana secretary of state, 8585 Archives Avenue, Baton Rouge, LA 70809, (225) 287-7476, spoke for information only on Senate Bill No. 22.

Representative Ivey offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 22 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 22 was reported with amendments by a vote of 13 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Duplessis, Farnum, Gadberry, Henry, Horton, Ivey, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Magee, Newell, Schamerhorn, and White voted yea. Representative Dwight abstained.

# Senate Bill No. 39 by Senator Hewitt

Senator Hewitt presented Senate Bill No. 39, which provides for remote operations of the legislature during a gubernatorially declared state of emergency.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 39 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 39 was reported favorably by a vote of 9 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Duplessis, Farnum, Gadberry, Henry, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Newell, and Schamerhorn voted yea. Representative Dwight abstained.
