III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Vice Chairman Mack in the chair.

House Bill No. 356 by Representative Landry

Representative Landry presented House Bill No. 356, which provides relative to the subject matter jurisdiction of certain courts.

Chairman Gaines in chair.

On behalf of Representative Landry, Representative Jones offered an amendment to change proposed law criteria that the court has jurisdiction irrespective of the amount in dispute or the value of the property involved to provide instead that the court has jurisdiction up to the jurisdictional limitations as provided in present law. Representative Jones offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gaines, Edmonston, Hughes, Jones, Landry, Mack, Marino, Pressly, and Stefanski voted yea.

Allain F. Hardin, 3203 Prytania St., New Orleans, LA 70115, (504) 522-1188, testified in support of House Bill No. 356.

Representative Landry offered a motion to report House Bill No. 356 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 356 was reported with amendments by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gaines, Edmonston, Hughes, Mike Johnson, Jones, Landry, Mack, Marino, Muscarello, Pressly, and Stefanski voted yea.

House Bill No. 726 by Representative Fontenot

On behalf of the author, Representative Zeringue presented House Bill No. 726, which provides relative to court reporter fees.

Representative Gaines offered an amendment to change the maximum amount charged for the annual renewal of a certificate from \$250 to \$175. Representative Gaines offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gaines, Edmonston, Hughes, Mike Johnson, Jones, Landry, Mack, Marino, Muscarello, Pressly, and Stefanski voted yea.

Representative Mack offered a motion to report House Bill No. 726 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 726 was reported with amendments by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gaines, Edmonston, Hughes, Mike Johnson, Jones, Landry, Mack, Marino, Muscarello, Pressly, and Stefanski voted yea.

House Bill No. 799 by Representative Hughes

On behalf of the author, Representative Gaines offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 799, which provides relative to e-liquid and vapor products. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 799 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gaines, Edmonston, Hughes, Mike Johnson, Jones, Landry, Mack, Marino, Muscarello, Pressly, and Stefanski voted yea.

House Bill No. 417 by Representative James

On behalf of the author, Representative Stefanski presented House Bill No. 417, which provides relative to the waiver of certain court costs and fees.

Representative Hughes offered a motion to report House Bill No. 417 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 417 was reported favorably by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gaines, Edmonston, Hughes, Mike Johnson, Jones, Landry, Mack, Marino, Muscarello, Pressly, and Stefanski voted yea.
