#### III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

# House Bill No. 184 by Representative Villio

Representative Villio presented House Bill No. 184, which provides for the lease of certain state property in Jefferson Parish.

Candace Watkins, City of Kenner, 417 N. Florida Street, Covington, LA 70433, (985) 249-8646, spoke in support of House Bill No. 184.

Representative Lyons offered a motion to report House Bill No. 184 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 184 was reported favorably by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Coussan, Bourriaque, Butler, Carrier, Cormier, DeVillier, Deshotel, Kerner, Landry, Lyons, Mincey, Riser, Romero, and Wheat voted yea.

# House Bill No. 111 by Representative Deshotel

Representative Deshotel presented House Bill No. 111, which authorizes the Red River, Atchafalaya, and Bayou Beouf Levee Districts to exchange property in Avoyelles Parish.

Representative Coussan offered amendments to make technical changes. Representative Coussan offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Coussan, Bourriaque, Butler, Carrier, Cormier, DeVillier, Deshotel, Kerner, Landry, Lyons, Mincey, Riser, Romero, and Wheat voted yea.

Representative Lyons offered a motion to report House Bill No. 111 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 111 was reported with amendments by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. #### House Bill No. 830 by Representative Zeringue

Representative Zeringue presented House Resolution No. 19, which approves the annual state integrated coastal protection plan for Fiscal Year 2021, as adopted by the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority Board.

Mr. Kline provided the committee with a booklet entitled "Fiscal Year 2021 Annual Plan, Integrated Ecosystem Restoration and Hurricane Protection in Coastal Louisiana", Exhibit A, which is included in the committee records.

Representative Cormier offered a motion to return the annual plan to the CPRA to make specified changes and then to resubmit it to the legislature, to which Representative Riser objected. Representative Riser offered a substitute motion to report House Resolution No. 19 favorably, to which Representative Cormier objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and House Resolution No. 19 was reported favorably by a vote of 12 yeas and 1 nay. Representatives Coussan,

Bourriaque, Butler, Carrier, Deshotel, Kerner, Landry, Lyons, Mincey, Riser, Romero, and Wheat voted yea. Representative Cormier voted nay.

Representative Riser offered a motion to report House Bill No. 181 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 181 was reported with amendments by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Coussan, Bourriaque, Butler, Carrier, Cormier, Deshotel, Kerner, Landry, Lyons, Mincey, Riser, Romero, and Wheat voted yea.
