III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7 by Senator Hewitt

Senator Hewitt presented Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7, which urges and requests certain officials and local governments to dismiss coastal lawsuits.

John Carmouche, Lead Counsel for Coastal Parishes, 4212 American Way, Suite B, Baton Rouge, LA, 70846, (225) 320-5785, spoke in opposition to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7.

Representative Landry offered amendments to make technical changes. Representative Landry offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments, to which Representative DeVillier objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 3 yeas and 10 nays. Representatives Kerner, Landry, and Lyons voted yea. Representatives Coussan, Bourriaque, Butler, Carrier, DeVillier, Deshotel, Mincey, Riser, Romero, and Wheat voted nay.

Representative DeVillier offered a motion to report Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7 favorably, to which Representative Landry objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7 was reported favorably by a vote of 10 yeas and 3 nays. Representatives Coussan, Bourriaque, Butler, Carrier, DeVillier, Deshotel, Mincey, Riser, Romero, and Wheat voted yea. Representatives Kerner, Landry, and Lyons voted nay.

Senate Bill No. 353 by Senator Hewitt

Senator Hewitt presented Senate Bill No. 353, which provides for carbon sequestration.

Representatives Coussan, Bourriaque, Butler, Carrier, DeVillier, Deshotel, Kerner, Landry, Lyons, Mincey, Riser, Romero, and Wheat voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 440 by Senator Fesi

Senator Fesi presented Senate Bill No. 440, which provides for enforcement of the Coastal Zone Management Program.

Representative DeVillier offered amendments to:

- 1. Authorize the secretary or the attorney general to bring such actions of state concern but no uses of local concern.
- 2. Authorize the appropriate district attorney and the local government, with an approved program, to bring actions of only local concern.
- 3. Limit the authority of a district attorney or local government to bring an action of local concern only within their jurisdiction.
- 4. Provide that the provisions of the Act are applicable to all claims existing or actions pending on the effective date of the Act and to all claims arising or actions filed on and after its effective date.
- 5. Make the bill effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Representative DeVillier offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments, to which Representative Kerner objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the amendments were adopted by a vote of 7 yeas and 5 nays. Representatives Coussan, Bourriaque, Butler, Carrier, DeVillier, Deshotel, and Riser voted yea. Representatives Kerner, Landry, Lyons, Mincey, and Wheat voted nay.

Representative Bourriaque offered amendments to add language stating that no district attorney shall have the authority to bring an action without the prior favorable vote of the local governing authority. Representative Bourriaque offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments, to which Representative Kerner objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 6 yeas and 6 nays. Representatives Bourriaque, Carrier, DeVillier, Deshotel, Riser, and Wheat voted yea. Representatives Coussan, Butler, Kerner, Landry, Lyons, and Mincey voted nay.

Representative DeVillier offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 440 with amendments, to which Representative Kerner objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and Senate Bill No. 440 was reported with amendments by a vote of 9 yeas and 3 nays. Representatives Coussan, Bourriaque, Butler, Carrier, DeVillier, Deshotel, Mincey, Riser, and Wheat voted yea. Representatives Kerner, Landry, and Lyons voted nay.

Mr. Hill offered the assistance of the Office of State Lands to the committee. He informed the committee that the Office of State Lands is responsible for the identification, administration, and management of state public lands and that the majority of the lands managed by the Office of State Lands is sovereign lands. Mr. Hill further stated that the primary goal of the Office of State Lands is to ensure the highest economic return and the maximum public use and best protection of the office's holding which is ensured through permitting, leasing, management, and good stewardship.
