### III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

#### **House Bill No. 13 by Representative Villio**

Representative Villio presented House Bill No. 13, which provides relative to the board of trustees of the Registrars of Voters Employees' Retirement Systems.

Representative Freeman offered a motion to report House Bill No. 13 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 13 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Beaulieu, Freeman, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

#### **House Bill No. 25 by Representative Villio**

Representative Villio presented House Bill No. 25, which provides relative to compensation considered in the calculation of contributions and benefits for the District Attorneys' Retirement System.

Representative Beaulieu offered a motion to report House Bill No. 25 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 25 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Beaulieu, Freeman, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

#### **House Bill No. 19 by Representative Mack**

Representative Mack presented House Bill No. 19, which provides relative to the selection of certain optional survivor benefits for members of the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System.

Representative Beaulieu offered a motion to report House Bill No. 19 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 19 was reported favorably by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Beaulieu, Emerson, Freeman, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

#### **House Bill No. 22 by Representative LaCombe**

Representative LaCombe presented House Bill No. 22, which provides relative to Louisiana School Boards Association employees' membership in retirement systems.

Representative Freeman offered amendments to add provisions for paying unaccrued liability to the Parochial Employees' Retirement System of Louisiana should an employee separate from service with the Louisiana School Boards Association. Representative Freeman offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Beaulieu, Emerson, Freeman, Illg, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

Dannie Garrett, Louisiana School Boards Association, 635 Main Street #3, Baton Rouge, LA 70801, (225) 382-0333, spoke in support of House Bill No. 22.

Representative Harris offered a motion to report House Bill No. 22 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 22 was reported with amendments by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Beaulieu, Emerson, Freeman, Illg, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

#### **House Concurrent Resolution No. 7 by Representative Mike Johnson**

Representative Mike Johnson presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 7, which memorializes congress to take actions necessary to review and eliminate or reduce the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision.

Representative Harris offered technical amendments to House Concurrent Resolution No. 7. Representative Harris offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Beaulieu, Emerson, Freeman, Illg, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

Representative Beaulieu offered a motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 7 with amendments. Without objection, House Concurrent Resolution No. 7 was reported with amendments by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Beaulieu, Emerson, Freeman, Illg, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.


There were no announcements.
