III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Senate Bill No. 21 by Senator Robert Mills

Senator Robert Mills presented Senate Bill No. 21, which provides for the purchase of service and salary credit for members furloughed due to COVID-19.

Representative Jefferson offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 21 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 21 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Beaulieu, Firment, Jefferson, and Tarver voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 13 by Senator Price

Senator Price presented Senate Bill No. 13, which allows upgrade of the accrual rate applicable to transferred service credit.

Senate Bill No. 24 by Senator Price

Senator Price presented Senate Bill No. 24, which provides a minimum benefit increase for certain retirees, beneficiaries, and survivors of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana, Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System, Louisiana School Employees' Retirement System, and State Police Retirement System.

Representative Bacala offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 24 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 24 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Firment, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

House Bill No. 24 by Representative Adams

Representative Adams presented House Bill No. 24, which authorizes members of the Louisiana State Police Retirement System to purchase additional service credits at the time of retirement.

Representative Adams offered a motion to report House Bill No. 24 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 24 was reported favorably by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Beaulieu, Firment, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

House Bill No. 28 by Representative Adams

Representative Adams presented House Bill No. 28, which provides relative to beneficiaries within the Firefighters' Retirement System.

Representative Harris offered technical amendments. Representative Harris offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Beaulieu, Firment, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

Representative Harris offered amendments to remove provisions pertaining to the removal of a former spouse as a beneficiary. Representative Harris offered a motion to adopt the proposed

amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Beaulieu, Firmont, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

Representative Harris offered amendments to add provisions making a disability determination for retirement purposes sufficient for survivor purposes. Representative Harris offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Beaulieu, Firmont, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

Representative Adams offered a motion to report House Bill No. 28 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 28 was reported with amendments by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Beaulieu, Firmont, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

Witness cards submitted by individuals who did not speak are as follows: 1 in support. Witness cards are included in the committee records.

House Bill No. 29 by Representative Jefferson

Representative Jefferson presented House Bill No. 29, which provides relative to the Firefighters' Retirement System's Deferred Retirement Option Plan (DROP) and unfunded accrued liability.

Representative Harris offered technical amendments. Representative Harris offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Beaulieu, Firmont, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

Representative Harris offered amendments that, relative to partial department dissolutions where the number of participating employees is less than 70% of what it was, change the number of employee positions that must be lost from two to three. Representative Harris offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Beaulieu, Firmont, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.

Representative Harris offered amendments to :

1. Provide that if a member chooses to participate in DROP for more than three years, his benefits are calculated using a five year final average compensation.
2. Provide that the decision of how long a member participates in DROP is irrevocable.
3. Provide for recovery of attorney fees and court costs through a concursus proceeding.

Representative Harris offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Adams, Bacala, Beaulieu, Firment, Jefferson, Nelson, and Tarver voted yea.
