III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 842 by Representative McMahen

This is a continuation of the discussion on House Bill No. 842 from an earlier meeting held on March 29, 2022. Please check for the prior action to complete the record of discussion and motions on House Bill No. 842.

Representative McMahen presented House Bill No. 842, which provides relative to liability for veterinary professionals for the reporting of animal cruelty.

On behalf of the author, Representative Robby Carter offered amendments to:

- (1) Enumerate reportable animal cruelty-related crimes.
- (2) Add requirement that animal control officers be P.O.S.T. certified.
- (3) Provide for instances when the veterinarian or veterinary technician may release confidential information.
- (4) Provide that proposed law shall not apply in cases where the veterinarian or veterinary technician acts with willful misconduct.

Representative Robby Carter offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Robby Carter, Echols, Frieman, Hodges, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, and Nelson voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

Representative Gregory Miller offered an amendment to add a requirement that veterinarians and veterinary technicians be licensed. Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gregory Miller, Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Robby Carter, Echols, Frieman, Hodges, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, and Nelson voted yea.

Representative Mike Johnson offered a motion to report House Bill No. 842 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 842 was reported with amendments by a vote of 10 yeas, 0 nays,

and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Robby Carter, Echols, Frieman, Hodges, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, and Nelson voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

House Bill No. 903 by Representative Gregory Miller

Representative Gregory Miller presented House Bill No. 903, which provides for the parish of execution of remote online notarial acts.

Representative Gregory Miller offered amendments to:

- (1) Make technical changes.
- (2) Provide for venue for contracts that are remote online notarial acts.

Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gregory Miller, Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Robby Carter, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Muscarello, and Nelson voted yea.

Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to report House Bill No. 903 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 903 was reported with amendments by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gregory Miller, Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Robby Carter, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Muscarello, and Nelson voted yea.

House Bill No. 905 by Representative Gregory Miller

Representative Gregory Miller presented House Bill No. 905, which provides relative to partition by licitation.

Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to report House Bill No. 905 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 905 was reported favorably by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gregory Miller, Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Robby Carter, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Muscarello, and Nelson voted yea.

House Bill No. 57 by Representative Hollis

Representative Hollis presented House Bill No. 57, which provides relative to homeowners association privileges.

Representative Robby Carter offered amendments to add an exception for monthly fees and assessments and add that a recorded sworn statement preserves the privilege against the lot.

Representative Robby Carter offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Robby Carter, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Hodges, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Muscarello, and Nelson voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

At the request of the author, Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 57. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 57 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gregory Miller, Amedee, Boyd, Brown, Robby Carter, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Hodges, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, Muscarello, and Nelson voted yea.
