# III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

# House Bill No. 885 by Representative Mike Johnson

At the request of Representative Mike Johnson, Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 885, which provides for the use of prehearing videotape as evidence in administrative appeals of justified reports of child abuse or neglect. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 885 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gregory Miller, Amedee, Boyd, Echols, Emerson, Frieman, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea.

# House Bill No. 146 by Representative Charles Owen

Representative Charles Owen presented House Bill No. 146, which provides relative to consent with regard to certain medical procedures. Representative Charles Owen provided the committee with a handout, Exhibit A, which is included in the committee records.

Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gregory Miller, Boyd, Echols, Emerson, Frieman, Garofalo, Jenkins, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea.

Representative Seabaugh offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 102 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 102 was reported with amendments by a vote of 10 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Boyd, Echols, Emerson, Frieman, Garofalo, Jenkins, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

Representatives Boyd, Echols, Emerson, Frieman, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

# **House Bill No. 705 by Representative Seabaugh**

Representative Seabaugh presented House Bill No. 705, which provides relative to additional medical examinations.

Representative Seabaugh offered amendments to:

- (1) Remove requirement of a party to submit to an examination as soon after the incident that caused the action in controversy as demanded by the requesting party and thereafter when reasonably necessary.
- (2) Provide that the party shall not be examined by more than one duly qualified medical practitioner in any one field or specialty for the same injury except for good cause shown.
- (3) Prohibit individuals and emancipated minors from having the examination videotaped or having a third party present.

Representative Seabaugh offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Boyd, Echols, Emerson, Frieman, Garofalo, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, McCormick, Muscarello, Nelson, and Seabaugh voted yea. Representative Gregory Miller abstained.

Representative Gregory Miller abstained.
