The administrative assistant called the roll, and by a vote of 9 yeas and 5 nays, the committee nominated Robert Warren Grand, Group B. Representatives Beaullieu, Farnum, Gadberry, Horton, Mike Johnson, Lyons, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representatives Stefanski, Wilford Carter, Deshotel, Duplessis, and Ivey voted nay.

Representative Duplessis offered a motion to nominate Cherrell Simms Taplin, Group A, for the Board of Ethics vacancy, to which Representative Lyons objected. Representative Lyons offered a substitute motion to nominate La Koshia Reconda Roberts, Group A, for the Board of Ethics vacancy. The administrative assistant called the roll, and by a vote of 11 yeas and 3 nays, the committee nominated La Koshia Reconda Roberts, Group B. Representatives Stefanski, Beaullieu, Deshotel, Farnum, Gadberry, Horton, Mike Johnson, Lyons, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representatives Wilford Carter, Duplessis, and Ivey voted nay.
