III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Senate Bill No. 5 by Senator Hewitt

Senator Hewitt presented Senate Bill No. 5, which provides for redistricting of Louisiana congressional districts.

Representative Stefanski offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on Senate Bill No. 5. Without objection, action on Senate Bill No. 5 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Stefanski, Beaullieu, Deshotel, Duplessis, Farnum, Gadberry, Hodges, Horton, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Lyons, Thomas, and White voted yea.

Witness cards submitted by individuals who did not speak are as follows: 4 in support, and 4 in opposition. Witness cards are included in the committee records.

House Bill No. 12 by Representative Bryant

Representative Bryant presented House Bill No. 12, which provides relative to the districts for members of the United States Congress.

Representative LaCombe offered amendments to make changes to districts 1 through 6. Representative LaCombe offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Stefanski, Wilford Carter, Deshotel, Duplessis, Farnum, Gadberry, Hodges, Horton, Ivey, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea.

Representative Newell offered a motion to report House Bill No. 12 with amendments, to which Representative Horton objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 7 yeas, 8 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Wilford Carter, Duplessis, Ivey, LaCombe, Lyons, Newell, and White voted yea. Representatives Beaullieu, Deshotel, Farnum, Gadberry, Hodges, Horton, Mike Johnson, and Thomas voted nay. Representative Stefanski abstained.

House and Governmental Affairs February 14, 2022

House Bill No. 22 by Representative Ivey

Representative Ivey presented House Bill No. 22, which provides for the redistricting of the supreme court.

Representative Ivey offered amendments to:

- (1) Make changes to districts 1 through 7.
- (2) Make proposed law effective January 1, 2023, for all purposes.

Representative Ivey offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Stefanski, Wilford Carter, Deshotel, Duplessis, Farnum, Gadberry, Ivey, LaCombe, Lyons, Newell, and Thomas voted yea.

Vice Chairman Duplessis in the chair.

Representative Ivey provided a handout entitled, "Current Justices on the Louisiana Supreme Court", which is labeled Exhibit A and is included in the committee records.

Representative LaCombe in the chair.

Vice Chairman Duplessis in the chair.

Representative Ivey offered a motion to report House Bill No. 22 with amendments, to which Representative Horton objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and House Bill No. 22 was reported with amendments by a vote of 10 yeas and 7 nays. Representatives Wilford Carter, Duplessis, Ivey, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Lyons, Magee, Newell, and White voted yea. Representatives Beaullieu, Deshotel, Farnum, Gadberry, Hodges, Horton, and Thomas voted nay.

Witness cards submitted by individuals who did not speak are as follows: 6 in support. Witness cards are included in the committee records.
