III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 167 by Representative DeVillier

Representative DeVillier presented House Bill No. 167, which reduces the severance tax rate for oil over a certain period of time and specifies the severance tax rate for oil produced from certain wells.

Mr. Mike Moncla, Louisiana Oil and Gas Industry (LOGA), 1331 Lakeridge Drive, Baton Rouge, LA 70802, (225) 388-9525, spoke in support of House Bill No. 167.

Mr. Guy Cormier, Police Jury Association of Louisiana (PJAL), 707 North 7th Street, Baton Rouge, LA 70802, (337) 207-8591, spoke in opposition to House Bill No. 167.

Representative DeVillier offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 167. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 167 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, Butler, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Magee, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, and Schlegel voted yea.

House Bill No. 716 by Representative McCormick

Representative McCormick presented House Bill No. 716, which reduces the rate of the severance tax levied on oil, certain distillate, and natural gas over a specified period of time.

Representative Bishop offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 716. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 716 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, Butler, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, Magee, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, and White voted yea.

Witness cards submitted by individuals who did not speak are as follows: 2 in support and 4 in opposition. Witness cards are included in the committee records.

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House Concurrent Resolution No. 6 by Representative McCormick

Representative McCormick presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 6, which removes wind and solar farms from ITEP.

Representative Bishop offered amendments which define the terms "solar farm" and "wind farm". Representative Bishop offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, Butler, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, Magee, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, and White voted yea.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 6 with amendments, to which Representative Magee objected. Representative Magee offered a substitute motion to involuntarily defer action on House Concurrent Resolution No. 6. After a lengthy discussion, Representative Beaullieu withdrew his motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 6 with amendments. No vote was taken. Representative Magee also withdrew his substitute motion to involuntarily defer action on House Concurrent Resolution No. 6. No vote was taken.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Concurrent Resolution No. 6. Without objection, action on House Concurrent Resolution No. 6 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 15 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bryant, Butler, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, Magee, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

House Bill No. 429 by Representative Hilferty

Representative Hilferty presented House Bill No. 429, which establishes a state sales and use tax rebate for the purchase of construction materials by certain charitable organizations.

Representative Bishop offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 429. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 429 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bryant, Butler, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.
