III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 586 by Representative Stefanski

At the request of Representative Stefanski, Representative Gregory Miller offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 586, which provides for civil liability for actions related to fentanyl. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 586 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 10 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Gregory Miller, Robby Carter, Echols, Frieman, Garofalo, Hodges, Jefferson, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, and Knox voted yea.

House Bill No. 379 by Representative McKnight

Representative McKnight presented House Bill No. 379, which provides relative to liability associated with parades.

Representative Jefferson offered a motion to report House Bill No. 379 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 379 was reported favorably by a vote of 9 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention.
