Minutes of Meeting 2023 Regular Session May 31, 2023

I. CALL TO ORDER

Representative Lance Harris, chairman of the House Committee on Education, called the meeting to order at 10:08 a.m. in Room 1, in the state capitol in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

III. BUSINESS

Chairman Harris announced that the committee would observe a three-minute rule for presenters and speakers on ensuing instruments.

House Resolution No. 190 by Representative Freiberg

Representative Freiberg presented House Resolution No. 190, which requests the state Department of Education, in consultation with the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, to study pathways to the teaching profession.

Representative Brass offered a motion to report House Resolution No. 190 favorably. Without objection, House Resolution No. 190 was reported favorably by a vote of 8 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Brass, Freiberg, Jefferson, Charles Owen, Phelps, St. Blanc, and Tarver voted yea.

House Resolution No. 13 by Representative Hodges

Representative Hodges presented House Resolution No. 13, which requests school-level reporting by public elementary, secondary, and postsecondary schools relative to programs and activities related to critical race theory; diversity, equity, and inclusion; or transformative social emotional learning.

Representative Charles Owen offered amendments that limited the request for reporting relative to critical race theory (CRT) to the use of CRT as a foundational pedagogy. Representative Charles Owen offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Brass, Emerson, Freiberg, Jefferson, Charles Owen, Phelps, St. Blanc, and Tarver voted yea.

Representative Jefferson offered a motion to call the question on House Resolution No. 13, to which Representative Tarver objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 5 yeas and 5 nays. Representatives Brass, Freeman, Freiberg, Jefferson, and Phelps voted yea. Representatives Harris, Amedée, Charles Owen, St. Blanc, and Tarver voted nay.

Representative Amedée offered a motion to report House Resolution No. 13 favorably, to which Representative Jefferson objected. Representative Jefferson offered a substitute motion to involuntarily defer action on House Resolution No. 13, to which Representative Amedée objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and action on House Resolution No. 13 was involuntarily deferred by a vote of 6 yeas, 5 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Brass, Freeman, Freiberg, Jefferson, Phelps, and St. Blanc voted yea. Representatives Amedée, Emerson, Geymann, Charles Owen, and Tarver voted nay. Representative Harris abstained.

Witness cards submitted by those who did not speak are as follows: 9 in support, and 3 in opposition. Witness cards are included in the committee records.

Representative Charles Owen offered a motion to call the question on House Resolution No. 192. Without objection, by a vote of 8 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention, the question was called. Representatives Amedée, Emerson, Freeman, Geymann, Jefferson, Charles Owen, Phelps, and St. Blanc voted yea. Representative Harris abstained.

Representatives Amedée, Emerson, Geymann, Charles Owen, and St. Blanc voted yea. Representatives Freeman, Jefferson, and Phelps voted nay. Representative Harris abstained.

House Resolution No. 199 by Representative Amedée

Representative Amedée presented House Resolution No. 199, which requests that the state Department of Education conduct a survey relative to recess at charter schools.

Representative Amedée offered a motion to report House Resolution No. 199 favorably. Without objection, House Resolution No. 199 was reported favorably by a vote of 7 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Harris, Amedée, Emerson, Geymann, Jefferson, Charles Owen, and St. Blanc voted yea.
