III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Senate Bill No. 152 by Senator Milligan

Senator Milligan presented Senate Bill No. 152, which creates the Louisiana Cybersecurity Commission.

Representative Newell offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 152 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 152 was reported favorably by a vote of 10 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Deshotel, Farnum, Gadberry, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Nelson, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 20 by Senator Carter

Senator Carter presented Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 20, which requests the Louisiana Department of Health to convene a task force to make recommendations regarding nursing involvement to improve maternal outcomes.

Representative Newell offered a motion to report Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 20 favorably. Without objection, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 20 was reported favorably by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Deshotel, Farnum, Gadberry, Ivey, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Magee, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Senate Bill No. 129 by Senator Cloud

Senator Cloud presented Senate Bill No. 129, which requires certain state entities to report corrective actions taken to mitigate state risk exposure upon request of the litigation subcommittee of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.

Representative Magee offered technical amendments. Representative Magee offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 10 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Deshotel, Farnum, Gadberry, Ivey, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Magee, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Representative Magee offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 129 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 129 was reported with amendments by a vote of 10 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Deshotel, Farnum, Gadberry, Ivey, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Magee, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 8 by Senator Kleinpeter

Senator Kleinpeter presented Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 8, which creates the Task Force on Safety for Law Enforcement Officers Involved in High Speed Vehicle Pursuits to study and review police officer training and protocols necessary to increase the safety of law enforcement officers and innocent bystanders.

Representative Magee offered a motion to report Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 8 favorably. Without objection, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 8 was reported favorably by a vote of 10 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Farnum, Gadberry, Ivey, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Magee, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 38 by Senator Robert Mills

Senator Robert Mills presented Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 38, which recognizes the North Louisiana Legislative Delegation of the legislature.

Representative Magee offered a motion to report Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 38 favorably. Without objection, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 38 was reported favorably by a vote of 10 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Farnum, Gadberry, Ivey, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Magee, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 19 by Senator Talbot

Senator Talbot presented Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 19, which creates the Task Force on Available and Affordable Commercial Motor Vehicle Insurance.

Representative Mike Johnson offered amendments to add a requirement that any designee organization that qualifies as nonprofit shall comply with IRS filing requirements in order to participate in committee proceedings. Representative Mike Johnson offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 10 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Farnum, Gadberry, Ivey, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Magee, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Representative Magee offered a motion to report Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 19 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 19 was reported with amendments by a vote of 11 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Farnum, Gadberry, Ivey, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Magee, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7 by Senator Talbot

Senator Talbot presented Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7, which urges the commissioner of insurance to create the Hurricane Mitigation Commission to study and report findings and recommendations relative to the handling of property insurance claims in the wake of hurricanes and the necessity of a catastrophe savings account.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to report Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7 favorably. Without objection, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7 was reported favorably by a vote of 10 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Farnum, Gadberry, Ivey, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Senate Bill No. 84 by Senator Luneau

On behalf of Senator Luneau, Representative Beaullieu presented Senate Bill No. 84.

Representative Beaullieu offered amendments that:

- (1) Required the board to send a communication electronically to the filing party rather than requiring any communication from the board to be sent electronically to a filing party.
- (2) Specified that the communication does not replace any other type of notice required by law.
- (3) Changed the effective date to January 1, 2024.

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Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 9 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Gadberry, Ivey, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.

Representative Newell offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 84 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 84 was reported with amendments by a vote of 9 yeas, 0 nays, and 1 abstention. Representatives Beaullieu, Gadberry, Ivey, Jenkins, Mike Johnson, LaCombe, Newell, Thomas, and White voted yea. Representative Stefanski abstained.
