III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Senate Bill No. 42 by Senator Fred Mills

Senator Fred Mills presented Senate Bill No. 42, which creates the Louisiana Watershed Initiative.

House Concurrent Resolution No. 72 by Representative Kerner

Representative Kerner presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 72, which urges and requests the United States Army Corps of Engineers to reconsider the mitigation and stewardship plan for the Mid-Barataria Sediment Division to include tidal levee protection for Lafitte, Barataria, and Crown Point.

Representative Horton offered a motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 72 favorably. Without objection, House Concurrent Resolution No. 72 was reported favorably by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. House Concurrent Resolution No. 63 by Representative Adams
