III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

Senate Bill No. 34 by Senator Bernard

Senator Bernard presented Senate Bill No. 34, which provides for "Crisis Lifeline dial 988" to be included on all state-issued driver's licenses and personal identification cards and the home page of LA Wallet.

Karen Stubbs, Louisiana Department of Health, 628 N. 4th St., Baton Rouge, LA 70802, (225) 342-9000, spoke for information only on Senate Bill No. 34.

Representative Freiberg offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 34 favorably. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 34 was reported favorably by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Wright, Brass, Cormier, Edmonston, Firment, Freiberg, Gadberry, Glover, Horton, Moore, Pierre, and Schamerhorn voted yea.

Senate Bill No. 145 by Senator Hensgens

Senator Hensgens presented Senate Bill No. 145, which provides for methods to contract for certain airport facilities.

Representative Pierre offered amendments to:

- (1) Define "design-builder" and specify the qualification of a design-builder.
- (2) Add requirements for the design-build process proposals and evaluations.
- (3) Specify that awarded contract prices cannot be increased except for inflation or unknown conditions.
- (4) Specify that proposed law will supersede any conflicting provisions.

Representative Pierre offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Wright, Brass, Cormier,

Edmonston, Firment, Freiberg, Gadberry, Glover, Horton, Moore, Pierre, and Schamerhorn voted yea.

Representative Pierre offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 145 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 145 was reported with amendments by a vote of 11 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Wright, Brass, Cormier, Edmonston, Firment, Freiberg, Gadberry, Glover, Horton, Moore, and Pierre voted yea.

Chris Groh, no information provided, spoke for information only on Senate Bill No.145.

Senate Bill No. 167 by Senator Abraham

Senator Abraham presented Senate Bill No. 167, which provides relative to design-build.

- (1) Remove the provisions for use of design-build contracts by airport authorities.
- (2) Remove the provisions for design-build contracts and qualifications of design-builders components.

Representative Gadberry offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Wright, Brass, Cormier, Edmonston, Firment, Freiberg, Gadberry, Glover, Horton, Moore, Charles Owen, and Pierre voted yea.

Representative Gadberry offered a motion to report Senate Bill No. 167 with amendments. Without objection, Senate Bill No. 167 was reported with amendments by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Wright, Brass, Cormier, Edmonston, Firment, Freiberg, Gadberry, Glover, Horton, Moore, Charles Owen, and Pierre voted yea.

House Resolution No. 177 by Representative DuBuisson
