### **III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION**

#### House Bill No. 277 by Representative Bagley

Representative Bagley presented House Bill No. 277, a constitutional amendment which provides relative to severance tax revenues remitted to parishes in which the associated severance occurs.

Representative LaCombe offered a motion to report House Bill No. 277 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 277 was reported favorably by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, Butler, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, Mincey, Orgeron, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

#### House Bill No. 280 by Representative Bagley

Representative Bagley presented House Bill No. 280, which requires parishes to use portions of severance tax revenues received from the state for economic development activities and infrastructure projects.

Representative Bishop offered a technical amendment to identify by bill number the proposed constitutional amendment on which the effectiveness of proposed law is contingent. Representative Bishop offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, Butler, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to report House Bill No. 280 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 280 was reported with amendments by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, Butler, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

# House Bill No. 278 by Representative McFarland

Representative McFarland presented House Bill No. 278, a constitutional amendment which increases amounts of severance tax revenues remitted to parishes and requires that portions of these amounts be spent on parish transportation projects.

Representative Bishop offered a motion to report House Bill No. 278 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 278 was reported favorably by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

## House Bill No. 172 by Representative DeVillier

Representative DeVillier presented House Bill No. 172, which reduces the severance tax rate for oil over a certain period of time and fixes the severance tax rate for oil produced from certain wells at the current rate.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to report House Bill No. 172 favorably, to which Representative Willard objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and House Bill No. 172 was reported favorably by a vote of 11 yeas and 2 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, and White voted yea. Representatives Landry and Willard voted nay.
