III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION

House Bill No. 428 by Representative Pressly

Representative Pressly presented House Bill No. 428, which extends to estates, trusts, and partnerships the flow-through entity income exclusion allowed to individuals.

Mr. Luke Morris, deputy secretary, Louisiana Department of Revenue (DOR), 617 North 3rd Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana 70802, (985) 662-8411, spoke for information only on House Bill No. 428.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to report House Bill No. 428 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 428 was reported favorably by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

House Bill No. 502 by Representative McFarland

Representative McFarland presented House Bill No. 502, which modifies the definition of the term commercial farmer by removing certain reporting requirements.

Representative Beaullieu offered amendments which: (1) revise the definition of commercial farmer for purposes of state sales and use tax exemptions; (2) remove the requirement that lessee landowners submit documentation of the joint venture arrangement or report farm income and expenses from the joint venture on a federal Schedule F form or similar federal tax form; and (3) add prohibition for state sales and use tax exemptions available to commercial farmers from being allowed or claimed for or related to an "activity not engaged in for profit" as that term is defined in present federal law.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Riser offered a motion to report House Bill No. 502 without amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 502 was reported without amendments by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

House Bill No. 391 by Representative Fontenot

On behalf of Representative Fontenot, Representative Bishop offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 391, which authorizes an individual income tax deduction for property insurance premium costs for taxpayers' primary residences. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 391 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

House Bill No. 303 by Representative Ivey

Representative Ivey presented House Bill No. 303, which provides for a flat rate for purposes of calculating income tax for individuals, estates, and trusts and modifies certain income tax deductions and credits.

Representative Willard offered a conceptual amendment to remove the repeal of the earned income tax credit. Representative Willard offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments, to which Representative DeVillier objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 2 yeas and 10 nays. Representatives Bishop and Willard voted yea. Representatives Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, and White voted nay.

Representative Bishop offered amendments which: (1) add audiologists to the list of professionals authorized to certify the condition of a taxpayer claiming the exemption or deduction for being deaf; and (2) reduce the income tax rate for the resident and non resident estates and trust to 4.25%. Representative Bishop offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Bishop offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 303. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 303 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

House Bill No. 153 by Representative DeVillier

Representative DeVillier offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 153, a constitutional amendment which phases-in, over a four year period, a property tax exemption for items constituting business inventory. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 153 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Witness cards submitted by individuals who did not speak are as follows: 2 in support and 3 in opposition. Witness cards are included in the committee records.

House Bill No. 371 by Representative Ivey

Representative Ivey presented House Bill No. 371, which to establish the La. Economic Advancement Plan (LEAP) which provides for ad valorem tax exemptions for certain capital investment projects.

Representative Riser offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 371. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 371 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

House Bill No. 473 by Representative Ivey

On behalf of Representative Ivey, Representative Bishop offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 473, a constitutional amendment which establishes certain property tax exemptions for capital investment projects. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 473 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

House Bill No. 382 by Representative Garofalo

Representative Garofalo presented House Bill No. 382, which authorizes establishment of tax-advantaged catastrophe savings accounts to cover losses from damage to taxpayers' primary residences and commercial property.

Representative Bishop offered an amendment to add provision that provisions of proposed law apply to income tax periods beginning on or after January 1, 2024. Representative Bishop offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Bishop offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 382. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 382 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, and Willard voted yea.

House Bill No. 241 by Representative Beaullieu

Representative Beaullieu presented House Bill No. 241, which provides for a flat rate for purposes of calculating the income tax for individuals, estates, and trusts.

Representative Beaullieu offered conceptual amendments which: (1) change the rate of the flat tax to 3.47%; (2) establish a tax credit equal to 47% of income taxes paid on individual income of less than \$12,500; and (3) establish a tax credit equal to 11% of income taxes paid on individual income between \$12,500 and \$50,000. Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Beaullieu offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 241. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 241 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.
