Minutes of Meeting 2023 Regular Session May 8, 2023

## I. CALL TO ORDER

Representative Stuart J. Bishop, chairman of the House Committee on Ways and Means, called the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m. in Room 6, in the state capitol in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

### **III. DISCUSSION OF LEGISLATION**

#### House Bill No. 408 by Representative Willard

Representative Willard presented House Bill No. 408, which extends the termination date of the research and development tax credit and provides for exceptions for certain taxpayers.

Representative Willard offered a conceptual amendment to remove extension of the sunset date of the tax credit program for research expenditures incurred, SBTT Program funds received, or SBIR Grant funds received. Representative Willard offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted by a vote of 15 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Phelps, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Willard offered a motion to report House Bill No. 408 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 408 was reported with amendments by a vote of 15 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Beaullieu, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Phelps, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

### House Bill No. 620 by Representative Freiberg

Representative Freiberg presented House Bill No. 620, which levies a tax on retail sales of cannabis and dedicates revenues derived from the tax.

Mr. Peter Robins-Brown, executive director, Louisiana Progress Action, 650 North 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana 70802, (504) 256-8196, spoke in support of House Bill No. 620 and provided a handout, Exhibit A, which is included in the committee records.

Representative Bishop offered amendments which: (1) authorize the La. Department of Revenue to require electronic filing of tax returns, reports, and payments by cannabis retailers; (2) require cannabis retailers to furnish to the La. Department of Revenue a bond in an amount of not less than \$5,000 guaranteeing payment of taxes, interest, and penalties levied pursuant to proposed law; (3) within the justice system funding provisions of proposed law, provide for consistency in references to fees and costs imposed by court systems; (4) establish reporting requirements for the justice system funding provised law; and (5) make technical changes.

Representative Bishop offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Landry offered a motion to report House Bill No. 620 with amendments, to which Representative Farnum objected. The administrative assistant called the roll, and the motion failed to pass by a vote of 6 yeas and 8 nays. Representatives Bishop, LaCombe, Landry, Orgeron, Phelps,

and Willard voted yea. Representatives Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, McMahen, Mincey, Riser, Schlegel, and White voted nay.

### House Bill No. 619 by Representative Landry

Representative Landry presented House Bill No. 619, which provides for applicability of sales tax to sales of admissions to certain museums.

Representative Landry offered a motion to report House Bill No. 619 favorably. Without objection, House Bill No. 619 was reported favorably by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Phelps, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

#### House Concurrent Resolution No. 55 by Representative Firment

Representative Firment presented House Concurrent Resolution No. 55, which memorializes congress to pass legislation allowing for tax-advantaged emergency savings accounts.

Representative Willard offered a motion to report House Concurrent Resolution No. 55 favorably. Without objection, House Concurrent Resolution No. 55 was reported favorably by a vote of 14 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Phelps, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

#### House Bill No. 631 by Representative Nelson

Representative Nelson presented House Bill No. 631, which provides with respect to the sourcing of sales for purposes of calculating Louisiana income.

Representative Riser offered amendments which: (1) delete provisions related to the sale, rental, lease, or license of tangible personal property and references to the rental, lease, or license of

immovable property and the lease or license of intangible property for purposes of assigning sales to La.; and (2) make technical changes. Representative Riser offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 13 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Bourriaque, Farnum, LaCombe, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Phelps, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative DeVillier offered a motion to report House Bill No. 631 with amendments. Without objection, House Bill No. 631 was reported with amendments by a vote of 10 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Statements submitted in accordance with House Rule 14.33 in lieu of appearing before the committee are as follows: 1 in support. Copies of these statements are included in the committee record.

### House Bill No. 518 by Representative Cormier

Representative Cormier presented House Bill No. 518, which provides for establishment of substantial nexus for purposes of income tax administration.

Representative Riser offered an amendment to make technical changes. Representative Riser offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendments. Without objection, the amendments were adopted by a vote of 10 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Riser offered a motion to voluntarily defer action on House Bill No. 518. Without objection, action on House Bill No. 518 was voluntarily deferred by a vote of 10 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

#### House Resolution No. 75 by Representative Bourriaque

Representative Bourriaque presented House Resolution No. 75, which requests a study concerning the process for taxpayer appeals of property assessments at the parish level.

Representative Bourriaque offered an amendment to change provisions regarding solicitation of input from taxpayers in the study effort from mandatory to permissive. Representative Bourriaque offered a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. Without objection, the amendment was adopted

by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

Representative Bourriaque offered a motion to report House Resolution No. 75 with amendments. Without objection, House Resolution No. 75 was reported with amendments by a vote of 12 yeas and 0 nays. Representatives Bishop, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.

### House Bill No. 629 by Representative Beaullieu

Representatives Bishop, Bourriaque, DeVillier, Farnum, Landry, McMahen, Mincey, Orgeron, Riser, Schlegel, White, and Willard voted yea.
