Monies in the fund shall be invested by the state treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund and interest earned on the investment of such monies shall be credited to the fund after compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana. Monies in the fund shall only be withdrawn pursuant to an appropriation by the legislature solely for allocation as provided in Subsection C of this Section to parishes in which video draw poker devices are licensed and operated.

C.(1) Monies so appropriated from the fund shall be allocated to each parish in which video draw poker devices are licensed and operated. The amount of the allocation for each parish shall be based upon the proportion of the total amount of fees, fines, and penalties the parish contributes to the statewide total.

(2) Monies allocated to each parish may be distributed to any political subdivision, special district, or public office within the parish, provided it is used for a public purpose as required by Article VII, Section 10(I) of the Louisiana Constitution, including but not limited to such entities as: parish governing authorities, school districts, law enforcement districts, offices of district attorneys, vocational-technical colleges, port commissions, tourist commissions, parish health units, incorporated municipalities, airport authorities, parish libraries, levee districts, clerks of court, assessors, road lighting districts, sewerage districts, drainage districts, water districts, or hospital service districts in accordance with the procedures provided in Paragraph (3) of this Subsection. Monies allocated may be used for operational expenses, such as salaries, or construction, maintenance, reconstruction, repairs, renovation of facilities, such as roads, bridges, schools, public buildings, parks, or other infrastructure. All monies distributed shall be expended in accordance with all applicable provisions of law relative to the expenditure of public funds including the public bid law, procurement codes, and provisions relative to the assumption of public debt.

(3) Monies in each parish allocation shall be distributed to the various entities provided in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection in the following manner:

(a) There shall be a Parish Review Committee for each parish receiving an allocation which shall be composed of the chief elected official of each of the following: the parish governing authority, the clerk of court, the law enforcement district, assessor, the school board, and each municipality within the parish. The clerk of court shall serve as the secretary/treasurer of the Parish Review Committee and keep all records of any proceedings.

(b) The Parish Review Committee shall meet no later than the first day of April of each year to recommend to the Executive Board for the parish an initial allocation of proceeds to be distributed to each of the entities within the parish and the proportion of the parish allocation which each such entity shall receive of the ensuing fiscal year's allocation.

(c) There shall be an Executive Board for each parish receiving an allocation which shall be composed of each of the state representatives and state senators representing all or a part of each parish receiving an allocation. The Executive Board shall make the final determination of the allocation within the parish for monies from the fund. Prior to the Executive Board meeting, the state representatives shall review the initial allocation of the Parish Review Committee and make any adjustments to the recipient entities or amounts to be distributed, as deemed necessary, and the state senators shall confirm the final distribution or return the recommendations to the representatives for reassessment before such determination is given to the Executive Board for action. The Executive Board shall meet and take action by adopting a final allocation for the parish no later than the first day of May of each year."
