"Section 18. In the event that the official forecast for Fiscal Year 1997-1998 is revised to incorporate revenues over and above the official forecast of revenues available for appropriation on January 27, 1997, and which are in excess of the revenues required to satisfy the appropriation contained in Section 17 of this Act, but only to the extent that such revenues are not attributable to the suspension or inapplicability of any exemptions to the sales and use tax levied pursuant to R. S. 47:321 and 322, the following sums or so much thereof as may be necessary are hereby appropriated out of the

monies in the state treasury from the sources specified for the year commencing July 1, 1997 and ending June 30, 1998; provided, however, this Section shall be subject to all conditions set forth in Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended. To the extent that such State General Fund revenues are less than the amount required to fund this appropriation, then the general fund appropriation shall be reduced proportionately.

Payable out of the State General Fund (Direct) for a \$150 for full-time and \$75 for part-time employee salary increase for all aides as defined per Department of Education Bulletin 1929 object code 115 (all functions), for clerical/secretarial employees object code 114 (all functions), for service workers object code 116 (all functions), for skilled craftsmen object code 117 (all functions), and for other noninstructional support services personnel object code 119 (functions 2300 through 3000) employed by the sixty-six public school systems and for nonpublic lunchroom employees eligible for state salary supplements

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 220, between lines 26 and 27, insert the following:

"Section 18. Urban Development Funding

Payable out of State General Fund Direct to provide grant awards to suburban areas of the state which shall only be distributed according to the following provisions:

- (1) Grants shall be available for projects, programs, or services including, but not limited to: capital outlay projects; economic development projects; educational programs; and elderly and youth services, and only to those entities which will utilize the funds to achieve a measurable improvement in health, environmental or living conditions or a measurable impact on economic development in the area in which the project or program is funded.
- (2) Grants shall be available to public entities, including the state and its agencies and subdivisions and private, nonprofit entities for projects or programs in suburban areas. A suburban area shall mean that portion of a parish with a population of not less than one hundred thousand and/or a municipality with a population of not less than 25,000 not currently receiving urban or rural development funds.
- (3) Grants shall be allocated within legislative districts or the portion of such districts which lie within the suburban areas. One-half of the total annual appropriation shall be allocated to the House of Representative districts, and one-half shall be allocated to Senate districts. The level of funding shall be determined on a pro rata basis to all qualifying suburban areas.
- (4) Grants shall be available only to entities which can demonstrate that they are supported by funding from other sources. All applicants must submit data relative to the service population or

geographic area to be served which, at a minimum, shall detail the socio-economic impact of a proposed project or grant.

- (5) No grant shall be considered which is not accompanied by a letter of support from the member of the legislature who represents the district to which the particular grant is allocated.
- (6) Funds shall be distributed to grant recipients on a monthly basis only upon submission of invoices. and all funds must be paid into a separate bank account from any other account the recipient may have.
- (7) The office of rural affairs shall administer this program and may establish rules and regulations to implement the same. \$ 5,000,000."
