Amnesty may be granted even if there exists a lien against the taxpayer's property, both movable and immovable, pursuant to R.S. 47:1577, if the department has initiated proceedings under the assessment and distraint procedure pursuant to R.S. 47:1569 through 1573, or if the department has entered into an installment agreement with the taxpayer. The department shall not collect one-half of the interest nor any penalties due to the state of Louisiana for those taxable periods that meet the requirements of this Subsection. No refunds shall be given for those amounts previously collected by the department from the taxpayer for a taxable period that meets the requirements of this Subsection; however, the taxpayer is obligated to pay any fees.

Appropriations for this purpose shall be allocated fifty percent each to the Affiliated Blind of Louisiana and the Louisiana Center for the Blind at Ruston. Monies in the fund shall be invested by the state treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund. Interest earned on investment of such monies shall be credited to the state general fund. Unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of each fiscal year shall remain in the fund."
