AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 2, line 14, after "thereon" delete the remainder of the line and delete lines 15 through 18 in their entirety and insert a period "."

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, between lines 18 and 19, insert the following:

- "(c) In order to promote and stimulate tourism and economic development in areas of the state which have licensed riverboats, the additional franchise fee provided in R.S. 27:91(C)(2) shall not be applicable and shall not be charged to any riverboat under license authorized by the Louisiana Riverboat Economic Development and Gaming Control Act which:
- (i) Is conducting gaming operations on the Red River, also known as the J. Bennett Johnston Waterway, as of the effective date of this Act and achieves a certified total capital investment per license of no less than two hundred fifty million dollars provided that at least sixty percent of such investment is in facilities other than riverboat and gaming equipment; or
- (ii) Is not conducting gaming operations on the Red River, also known as the J. Bennett Johnston Waterway, as of the effective date of this Act and achieves a certified total capital investment per license of no less than two hundred million dollars provided that at least sixty percent of such investment is in facilities other than riverboat and gaming equipment.
- (d) For purposes of R.S. 27:91(C)(2)(c), total capital investment shall mean and include the costs of the riverboat, gaming equipment, ramps and moorings, land, hotels, pavilions, parking facilities, entertainment facilities, furniture, and nongaming equipment. Costs shall include acquisition, design, development, engineering, construction, cost of capital, and improvements. In order to obtain the exemption provided in R.S. 27:91(C)(2)(c), the licensed gaming operator must obtain a certificate from the Louisiana Department of Economic Development certifying that the total capital investment for each licensed riverboat meets the requirements of R.S. 27:91(C)(2)(c). The Department of Economic Development must include capital investments reported to the Louisiana Gaming Control Board by the licensee. No capital investment shall be applied or credited to more than one licensed riverboat.'

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 3, line 19, after "(cc)" and before "Interstate" insert "(I)"

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 3, between lines 23 and 24, insert the following:

- (II) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, with respect to sales of interstate telecommunication services to any person for use in the operation of one or more call centers:
- (aaa) The tax imposed pursuant to this Chapter shall not apply to such sales reflected on bills submitted prior to July 1, 2002.
- (bbb) The tax imposed pursuant to this Chapter shall not exceed twenty-five thousand dollars per calendar year with respect to such sales reflected on bills submitted on or after July 1, 2002.
- (ccc) For purposes of applying the limitation set forth in R.S. 47:301(14)(i)(ii)(cc)(II)(bbb), all entities wholly owned by the same person or entity shall be considered a single person.
- (III) For purposes of R.S. 47:301(14)(i)(ii)(cc)(II), the term "call center" means one or more locations that utilize telecommunication services in one or more of the following activities: customer services, soliciting sales, reactivating dormant accounts, conducting surveys or research, fund raising, collection of receivables, receiving reservations, receiving orders, or taking orders. The limitations set forth in R.S. 47:301(14)(i)(ii)(cc)(II) shall apply only to holders of a direct payment number issued by the department pursuant to R.S. 47:303.1. In order to obtain such direct payment number, the applicant must establish that it satisfies the criteria set forth in R.S. 47:301(14)(i)(ii)(cc)(II). The provisions of R.S. 47:303.1(B)(1) and (3) shall not apply to any application for a direct payment number under R.S. 47:301(14)(i)(ii)(cc)(II). The department shall not issue any refunds of taxes paid prior to receiving a direct payment number.

AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 12, between lines 1 and 2, insert the following:

"Section 11. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, with respect to any local exchange company operating in more

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than twenty-five parishes, each estimated tax payment required under R.S. 47:287.654 to be made after January 1, 2001, and on or before June 30, 2001, shall be increased by nine hundred thousand dollars over the amount that would have been computed taking into account the credit established by R.S. 47:6014; provided, however, that any such local exchange company shall be entitled to the full amount of such credit in computing subsequent estimated payments and in computing its actual tax liability. For purposes of this Section, the term "local exchange company" means a telecommunication service provider that derives more than fifty percent of its revenues within Louisiana from the provision of local telephone service, as defined in R.S. 47:301(14)(i)(iv)(aa).

Section 12. Nothing in this Act shall be construed as imposing any tax, or authorizing the imposition of any tax, on any product or service, if the imposition of such tax would be prohibited by the Internet Tax Freedom Act (Public Law 105-277)."
