(2) After compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana relative to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund, and after a sufficient amount is allocated from that fund to pay all of the obligations secured by the full faith and credit of the state which become due and payable within any fiscal year, the treasurer shall pay an amount equal to the monies received by the state treasury in Fiscal Year 2001-2002 pursuant to the provisions of this Part which are more than three hundred thirty million dollars in excess of the monies collected from the individual income tax for Fiscal Year 2000-2001, as determined by the Revenue Estimating Conference, into the Education Enhancement Fund. For every fiscal year thereafter, the treasurer shall pay an amount equal to the monies received by the state treasury pursuant to the provisions of this Part which are more than three hundred million dollars in excess of the monies collected from the individual income tax for Fiscal Year 2000-2001, plus an inflation factor, as determined by the Revenue Estimating Conference, into the Education Enhancement Fund. The monies in this fund shall be used solely as provided by this Subsection and only in the amounts appropriated by the legislature. All unexpended and unencumbered monies in this fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund. The monies in the fund shall be invested by the state treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund, and shall be deposited into the state general fund.

- (3) Subject to an annual appropriation by the legislature, the monies in the Education Enhancement Fund shall be used solely for the following purposes:
- (a) To increase the pay of Louisiana elementary and secondary public classroom teachers employed by the city and parish public systems and special schools operated by the state to the average classroom teacher salary of the most recently estimated southern average for teachers and calculated by the Southern Regional Education Board.

- (b) To increase the pay of the faculty of the universities under the jurisdiction of the Board of Regents in amounts as determined by the legislature.
- (c) To increase the pay of all other personnel of the city and parish public elementary and secondary school systems and special schools operated by the state and of the universities under the jurisdiction of the Board of Regents in amounts as determined by the legislature.
