- (2) No classified employee shall be discriminated against because of his political or religious beliefs, sex, or race. A classified employee so discriminated against shall have the right of appeal to the commission. The burden of proof on appeal, as to the facts, shall be on the employee.
- (3) Any employee in the classified service who is aggrieved by any action of the city and who contends that such action violates his rights under the provisions of this Act may appeal to the commission within thirty days after such action.
