Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection D of this Section, the premium costs of group hospital, surgical, medical expense, and dental insurance and the first ten thousand dollars of life insurance contracted for under the provisions of this Section shall be paid in full from the sheriff's general fund for all sheriffs and deputy sheriffs retired with at least fifteen years of service who are at least fifty-five years of age <u>or retired with at least thirty years of service at any age</u>. The provisions of this Subsection shall be applicable only to the sheriffs' offices of the parishes of Bossier, St. Bernard, St. Martin, Acadia, Allen, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Bienville, Caddo, Calcasieu, Caldwell, Cameron, Catahoula, Concordia, DeSoto, East Feliciana, Grant, Iberville, Jackson, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Lincoln, Livingston, Madison, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Pointe Coupee, Rapides, Red River, St. Charles, St. James, St. John, Terrebonne, Union, Vermilion, Vernon, Washington, Webster, West Baton Rouge, West Carroll, and West Feliciana and the sheriff of the Civil District Court of the parish of Orleans, for their respective retirees. The provisions of this Subsection shall also apply to the employees of the Sheriffs' Pension and Relief Fund and the Louisiana Sheriffs' Association, which fund and association shall pay the premium costs for their employees.'

The register of conveyances and the recorder of mortgages shall prepare an index to their all records under his custody, in addition to the ones now in use; the additional index to be made by the number of squares and number of lots. All sales and mortgages of each lot shall be indexed in one volume so that a reference to the square number and lot number will show at a glance all alienations, all mortgages, and all cancellations of mortgages.

§268. Clerks may be employed; compensation

The register of conveyances and the recorder of mortgages may employ such clerks and assistants as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of R.S. 44:265-267. The number of such clerks and their salaries shall be fixed by the majority of the judges of the civil district

Section 2. R.S. 44:201.1, 203, 204, and 207 are hereby repealed in their entirety."
