(h) For the purpose of the imposition of sales and use tax imposed or levied by all taxing authorities in the state of any cellular, PCS, or wireless telephone used in connection with the sale or use of mobile telecommunications services, as defined in R.S. 47:301(10)(v) after August 1, 2002, the term "sales price" shall mean and include the greater of (i) the amount of money actually received by the dealer from the purchaser for each such telephone or (ii) twenty-five percent of the cost of such telephone to the dealer, but shall not include any amount received by the dealer from the purchaser for providing mobile telecommunications services and any commissions, fees, rebates, or other amounts received by the dealer from any source other than the purchaser as a result of or in connection with the sale of the telephone.

HOUSE BILL NO. 256— BY REPRESENTATIVE MONTGOMERY

AN ACT

To enact Chapter 42 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 33:9601 through 9610, and to amend and reenact R.S. 47:301(14)(i)(ii)(bb)(XV), relative to the taxation of telecommunications services; to create and establish a Louisiana Communications Tax District; to provide for the governance of the district by a board of directors; to provide for the authority, duties, powers, and responsibilities of

the district and its board of directors; to authorize the district to levy and collect a statewide excise tax on all communications services in lieu of other local taxes, charges, or fees imposed on providing communications services; to provide for the distribution of the proceeds of such tax to the local governmental subdivisions of the state; to prohibit the enforcement of existing obligations to pay certain local taxes, charges, and fees; to provide for definitions; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

(2) The district audit committee shall be comprised of three tax administrators who are currently employed by a Louisiana local governmental subdivision. One member of the audit committee shall be appointed by the Louisiana Municipal Association, one member shall be appointed by the Police Jury Association, and one member shall be appointed by the Louisiana Association of Tax Administrators.

(3) The duties of the district audit committee shall be as follows:

(a) To select taxpayers to be audited.

(b) To select or hire qualified auditors.

(c) To review auditors' findings.

(d) To oversee the district's tax assessments and appeals processes.

(e) To report any audit findings and assessments to the district at least annually.

(4) For purposes of this Subsection, "qualified auditors" shall mean district employees, local governmental tax auditors, or certified public accountants licensed in the state of Louisiana.

(5) Audit collections will be remitted to the local governmental subdivisions in the same manner as provided in this Chapter for current revenues.

(6) Any compensation to perform an audit by local governmental tax auditors or licensed certified public accountants shall be based on hourly fees plus direct expenses and shall not be on a contingency fee basis.

F. The district's financial statements, tax collections, and tax distributions shall be audited annually by an independent certified public accountant licensed in the state of Louisiana. The certified public accountant performing this audit may not perform taxpayer audits for the district."

Corporations, domestic or foreign, formed for the purpose of transmitting intelligence by telegraph or telephone or other system of transmitting intelligence, may construct and maintain telegraph, telephone, or other lines necessary to transmit intelligence along all public roads or public works, and along and parallel to any of the railroads in the state, and along and over the waters of the state, if the ordinary use of the roads, works, railroads, and waters are not obstructed, and along the streets, alleys, and rights-of-way of any eity, local governmental subdivision, with the consent of the city council or trustees subject to the provisions of R.S. 33:9601 et seq. Such companies shall be entitled to the right of way over all lands belonging to the state and over the lands, privileges, and servitudes of other persons, and to the right to erect poles, piers, abutments, and other works necessary for constructing and maintaining lines and works, upon making just compensation therefor. If the company fails to secure such right by consent, contract, or agreement upon just and reasonable terms, then the company has the right to proceed to expropriate as provided by law for railroads and other works of public utility, but shall not impede the full use of the highways, navigable waters, or the drainage or natural servitudes of the land over which the right of way may be exercised. No company, operating under the provisions of this Section, shall contract with the owners of land, a political subdivision, or with any other corporation for the right to erect and maintain any telephone, telegraph, or other line for transmission of intelligence over its lands, privileges, or servitudes, to the exclusion of the lines of other companies operating under the provisions of this Section.

* *

C. No company operating under the provisions of this Section shall commence any installation or maintenance or other construction on, over, or under any public street, alley, right-of-way, or other public property without first obtaining all construction, excavation, or other permits adopted in compliance with R.S. 33:9610."
