Any applicant or licensee who feels aggrieved by the action of the department in denying or revoking a license may appeal suspensively from the action within thirty days after receipt of the notification of the denial or revocation. This appeal or request for a hearing shall specify in detail reasons why the appeal is lodged and why the appellant feels aggrieved by the action of the department.

C. The appeal hearing shall be conducted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act."
