A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To suspend until sixty days after the final adjournment of the 2007 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana, the provisions R.S. 56:433(B)(1) and (C) and 435.1.1(C) insofar as they specify a date for closure of the oyster harvest on the public seed grounds and to authorize the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission to open or re-open oyster harvest season in those parts of the natural reefs where there are sufficient quantities of oysters available for harvest.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 31— BY REPRESENTATIVE ROBIDEAUX

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To direct the attorney general to examine the interaction between the applicable provisions of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 regarding income taxes and the provisions of the Louisiana Election Code and determine what, if any, implications exist if a displaced citizen files a nonresident or part-year resident state income tax form, particularly one listing an out-of-state address, and is registered to vote in Louisiana and votes in Louisiana elections; to design an appropriate notice to displaced citizens which simply and concisely outlines any such implications; and to expeditiously mail such notice to all displaced citizens of Louisiana with an out-of-state address in accordance with the most current list of such persons obtained by the attorney general from the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 34— BY REPRESENTATIVE GARY SMITH A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To direct the Department of Environmental Quality and the office of environmental education to cooperate with Keep Louisiana Beautiful, Incorporated to conduct a campaign to educate the public to prevent cigarette litter.

To amend and reenact R.S. 14:81(A) and (C) and to enact R.S. 14:81(D) through (J), relative to indecent behavior with juveniles; to amend elements of the crime to provide that reasonable belief that the victim is under the age of seventeen is sufficient to commit the crime of indecent behavior with a juvenile; to provide for definitions; to provide with respect to defenses for the crime of indecent behavior with juveniles; to provide for certain exceptions; to provide that evidence seized resulting from the commission of the crime of indecent behavior with juveniles is considered contraband; to require sex offender registration if convicted for the crime of indecent behavior with juveniles; and to provide for related matters.

BY REPRESENTATIVE DARTEZ AN ACT

To appropriate funds out of the General Fund of the state of Louisiana for Fiscal Year 2006-2007 to be used to pay certain consent judgments against the Department of Transportation and Development; and to provide for related matters.

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 3:3203(E) and R.S. 47:301(16)(f) and to enact R.S. 3:3221(G), relative to the registration of pharmaceuticals with the Department of Agriculture and Forestry; to prohibit certain pharmaceuticals and vaccines from being classified or registered as pesticides; to provide relative to sales tax exempt pharmaceuticals; and to provide for related matters.
