Upon approval of the State Civil Service Commission and the governor, and out of monies appropriated for this purpose, the salaries of commissioned law enforcement agents of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and commissioned law enforcement officers of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, excluding those in the state police service, shall be increased by an amount equal to the amount of the supplemental pay increase provided in this Act.

Section 3. The legislature does hereby urge and request the State Civil Service Commission to increase the salary of commissioned law enforcement officers of public institutions of higher education of the state. Upon approval of the State Civil Service Commission and the governor, and out of monies appropriated for this purpose, the salaries of commissioned law enforcement officers employed by any public institution of higher education of the state shall be increased by an amount equal to the amount of the supplemental pay increase provided in this Act.'
