AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 15:574.9(B) and Code of Criminal Procedure Art. 900(A)(5), and to enact R.S. 15:574.9(G); relative to probation and parole; to provide a commencement date for the term of the technical revocation; to allow those convicted of a misdemeanor to be eligible for a technical revocation at the discretion of the court; and to provide for related matters.

SENATE BILL NO. 291-BY SENATOR QUINN

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 14:40.2(B)(3) and (6)(a), relative to the crime of stalking; to enhance the penalties in certain circumstances; and to provide for related matters.

AN ACT To enact R.S. 14:102.23 and to repeal R.S. 14:102.1(D), relative to criminal offenses; to provide relative to the criminal code and to offenses against the state; to provide relative to the prohibition of certain activities and the penalties provided therefor; to provide relative to offenses against animals and affecting the public sensibility; to create the crime of cockfighting; to provide relative to the prosecution of such crime; to provide for definitions; to prohibit transportation of certain animals for certain purposes; to prohibit certain activities related to cockfighting; to provide relative to cruelty to animals; to provide relative to penalties, conditions, and requirements; and to provide for related matters.

To qualify for the exemption provided for in this Subsection, the commercial vehicle shall be covered at all times, except during loading and unloading, in a manner that prevents rain from reaching the waste, prevents waste from falling or blowing from the vehicle, and ensures that leachate from the waste is not discharged from the vehicle during transportation.

§2791. Parish Health Care Finance Act; purpose

The purpose of this Part is to increase access to needed health care services for the residents of any eligible parish by enhancing payments received by health care providers in that parish for services rendered to uninsured and Medicaid patients.

§2792. Definitions

As used in this Part, the term "parish" shall mean any parish that is eligible to and makes new certified public expenditures.

§2793. Parish cooperative endeavors for health care

Any parish and its parish health care providers are hereby authorized to enter into one or more cooperative endeavor agreements with health care providers in the parish for the purpose of enhancing the provision of health care services for uninsured and Medicaid patients. Payment under such agreements shall not exceed the maximum allowed by CMS for programs involving certified public expenditures.

§2794. Certification of parish public expenditures to the Department of Health and Hospitals

Any parish or parish health care provider may certify any and all eligible public health care expenditures to the department. The department shall use certified public expenditures from the parish or parish health care providers within the state's Medicaid program to acquire additional federal financial participation. All such federal financial participation attributable to new certified public expenditures from the parish or parish health care providers shall be used solely and exclusively by the department to enhance health care in that parish by, first, reimbursing hospitals in the parish for the eligible cost of care to the uninsured. To the extent that additional funds are then available, hospitals in the parish shall be reimbursed for any difference between total Medicaid reimbursement and the total allowable cost of providing care to those Medicaid patients. To the extent that any additional funds are then available, the funds shall be used to enhance primary care in the parish.

§2795. Approval of CMS required for implementation

A. The department shall, within sixty days of receipt from any parish of a detailed plan for creating new certified public expenditures:

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- Promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act which are necessary to implement the plan pursuant to this Part. The regulations shall require approval by the House Committee on Health and Welfare and the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare.
- (2) Submit to CMS for approval such amendment to the state Medicaid plan as is necessary to implement the plan pursuant to this
- B. In the event that the state plan amendment proposed by the department for the implementation of any plan pursuant to this Part is denied by CMS, the proposed plan shall cease to be effective.

§2796. State limitation on disproportionate share payments

- The provisions of this Part shall be operable only to the extent that the state has not exceeded the limit on total disproportionate share payments after making every reasonable effort to use appropriate Medicaid payment methodologies in lieu thereof.
- B. In the event that the total payments of all plans approved pursuant to this Part exceed that limit, the plans of all parishes with approved plans shall be ranked according to total eligible losses of the public hospitals in the parish, and those plans shall be funded according to that ranking, with the parish with the greatest total eligible losses fully funded first, followed by the parish with the next greatest total eligible losses, and so forth.

Section 2. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Act are hereby declared severable."
