For the satisfaction and payment of consent judgments, stipulated judgments, and other judgments against the state, if such judgments are final, and notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 49:112, the provisions of this Section contain appropriations in the total amount of Eight Million Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars, be it more or less estimated, as specifically provided in each Subsection. Provided, however, that all judgments provided for in this Section shall be paid as to principal, interest, court costs, and expert witness fees as provided in said judgments, it being the intent herein that when the provisions of any judgment conflict with the provisions of the respective House Bill or this Act, the provisions of the judgment shall be controlling. Any other provision of any such House Bill or this Act, not in conflict with the provisions of such judgment, shall control. Payment shall be made as to any such judgment only after presentation to the state treasurer of documentation required by the state treasurer. Further, all judgments provided for in this Section shall be deemed to have been paid on the effective date of the Act, and interest shall cease to run as of that date

B.
