(b) Each participant in the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students whose annual family income is greater than two hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be asked to sign a written consent form which informs the participant that, in order to receive or to continue receiving student financial assistance, the participant shall consent to random drug testing administered by the Board of Regents according to the provisions of this Section. The form shall inform the participant that, with his signature, the participant may be drug tested at any time as determined by the Board of Regents while the participant is receiving student financial assistance. A participant who does not sign the form granting consent to a drug test shall not be eligible to receive or continue receiving student financial assistance through TOPS.
