HOUSE BILL NO. 992— BY REPRESENTATIVE CONNICK AN ACT

To enact R.S. 44:4.1(B)(37) and R.S. 47:820.5.8 and 820.5.9, relative to tolls; to prohibit the extension of a toll; to provide for retention of records following the cessation of a toll; to provide for distribution of funds and property following expiration of a toll; to create a fund; and to provide for related matters.

HOUSE BILL NO. 993-

BY REPRESENTATIVE PATRICK WILLIAMS AN ACT

To enact R.S. 46:1430, relative to licensed child day care facilities; to provide for a minimum standard for child physical activity; to provide for a limitation on certain sedentary activities; to provide for duties of the Louisiana Advisory Council on Child Care and Early Education; to provide relative to definitions, standards, and guidelines for physical activity programs; to authorize the promulgation of rules; and to provide for related matters.

HOUSE BILL NO. 994-

BY REPRESENTATIVE LOPINTO

AN ACT
To amend and reenact R.S. 15:571.3(B)(1)(a), relative to diminution of sentence for good behavior; to change the rate that diminution of sentence is calculated for certain offenders; to provide for applicability; and to provide for related matters.

AN ACT
