On page 4, line 13, after "(a)" delete "<u>Delegate</u>" and insert "<u>Except</u> as provided in Subparagraph (c) of this Paragraph, delegate"

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 4, between lines 24 and 25, insert the following:

"(c) Make recommendations with respect to hiring, termination, and other personnel actions applicable to school support personnel to the local public school board, and the board shall take personnel actions only upon the recommendation of the superintendent. Such personnel are entitled to file a grievance in accordance with procedures adopted pursuant to R.S. 17:100.4 with respect to any such action."

Rep. Dixon moved the adoption of the amendments.

Rep. Dove objected.

By a vote of 38 yeas and 62 nays, the amendments were rejected.

Rep. Ortego sent up floor amendments which were read as follows:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 14, between lines 19 and 20, insert the following:

"Section 4. The provisions of Sections 1 through 3 of this Act shall be implemented as a three-year pilot program in certain city, parish, and other local public school systems to be selected by the state superintendent of education based on criteria established by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education. Such pilot program shall be administered by the state board pursuant to rules and regulations adopted by the board in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. The state board shall submit a written report of its findings, conclusions, and recommendations relative to such pilot program, including any recommendations for related legislation, to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education by not later than sixty days prior to the beginning of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature."

On page 14, line 20, change "Section 4." to "Section 5."

AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 14, line 23, change "Section 5." to "Section 6."
