This report is for House Bill No. 118 of the 2013 Regular Session by Representative Champagne, proposing to add Art. VII, Section 10.2(G) of the Constitution.

HB 118 requires that monies received by the state from violations of certain federal and state laws associated with the Deepwater Horizon oil spill shall be deposited into the Coastal Protection and Restoration Fund.

II. CONCLUSION

The proposed measure cannot be accomplished statutorily.

Due to the constitutional creation of and restrictions on the use of the Coastal Protection and Restoration Fund, the proposed changes to these restrictions in addition to the restrictions in allocations provided by other sections of the constitution would have to be granted by the constitution.

HB 131 requires legislation relative to tax rebates, tax incentives, and tax abatements to be introduced or considered only during sessions convening in odd-numbered years.

II. CONCLUSION

The proposed measure cannot be accomplished statutorily.

Since Const. Art. III, Section 2, establishes the matters which may be considered during legislative sessions, and HB 131 is proposing to add matters that can only be introduced and considered during certain legislative sessions, such changes can only be accomplished by amendment to the constitution.
