BY REPRESENTATIVE FANNIN

AN ACT Making annual appropriations for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 for the ordinary expenses of the executive branch of state government, pensions, public schools, public roads, public charities, and state institutions and providing with respect to the expenditure of said appropriations.

In the event that the additional revenues that are incorporated into the official forecast for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 due to the enactment of House Bill Nos. 119, 218, 355, 402, 445, 448, 466, 549, 624, 629, 635, 779, 805, 829, or 833 or House Concurrent Resolution Nos. 8 or 15 or any other legislative instrument from the 2015 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature are insufficient to fully fund all items contained in this Act which are designated as "SUPPLEMENTARY BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS", the appropriations contained under "SUPPLEMENTARY BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS" shall be reduced on a pro rata basis based upon the amount by which the additional revenues are insufficient to fully fund said appropriations.

(3) The commissioner of administration is hereby authorized and directed to adjust the means of financing in Schedule 08-419 Office of State Police by increasing the appropriation out of the State General Fund by Fees and Self-generated Revenues and reducing the appropriation out of the State General Fund by Statutory Dedications out of the Riverboat Gaming Enforcement Fund to adjust for revenues incorporated into the official forecast for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 due to the enactment of House Bill No. 448.

(4) The commissioner of administration is hereby authorized to adjust the means of financing in Schedule 08-419 Office of State Police by increasing the appropriation out of the State General Fund by Fees and Self-generated Revenues by \$20,000,000 and reducing the appropriation out of the State General Fund by Statutory Dedications out of the Transportation Trust Fund – Regular by \$20,000,000 to adjust for revenues incorporated into the official forecast for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 due to the enactment of House Bill No. 448.

(5) The commissioner of administration is hereby authorized to adjust the means of financing in Schedule 09-306 Medical Vendor Payments by reducing the appropriation out of the State General Fund (Direct) and increasing the appropriation out of the State

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General Fund by Statutory Dedications out of the Tobacco Tax Medicaid Match Fund to adjust for revenues incorporated into the official forecast for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 due to the enactment of House Bill No. 119." A. The Department of State and the board, jointly or separately, may solicit and accept funds, governmental grants, donations, and contributions of lands, buildings, monies, artifacts, relics, audio and video recordings, motion picture films, works of art, or other property on behalf of and as additions to the Chennault Aviation and Military Museum of Louisiana, either in the form of loans or in the form of donations inter vivos or mortis causa, and the Department of State may acquire them by purchase, lease, or otherwise, subject to the terms, conditions, or limitations contained in the instrument by which such property is acquired. However, the board may enter into any and all contracts with any person, lender, or donor that it may deem fit, proper, and necessary to accept and receive such lands, buildings, monies, artifacts, relics, audio and video recordings, motion picture films, works of art, or other property on behalf of and as additions to

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the Chennault Aviation and Military Museum of Louisiana. The museum may serve as the beneficiary of any public trust heretofore or hereafter created for such purpose pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 9:2341 et seq.

B. The board is granted the authority of deaccession with respect to any collection of the Chennault Aviation and Military Museum of Louisiana and, for such purpose, is exempted from laws relative to the sale or disposal of surplus property. The board shall establish policies and procedures necessary to carry out this authority in an orderly manner.

 \in B.(1) Any property which has been deposited with the Chennault Aviation and Military Museum of Louisiana, by loan or otherwise, and which has been held by the museum for more than ten years, and to which no person has made claim shall be deemed to be abandoned and, notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 1 of Title XII of Book III of the Louisiana Civil Code, shall become the property of the museum, provided that Paragraph (2) of this Subsection has been complied with.

(2)(a) At least once each week for two consecutive weeks, the board Department of State shall cause to be published in at least one newspaper of general circulation in the parish of Ouachita a notice and listing of the property.

(b) The notice shall contain:

(i) The name and last known address, if any, of the last known owner or depositor of the property.

(ii) A description of the property.

(iii) A statement that if proof of claim is not presented by the claimant to the board Department of State and if the claimant's right to receive such property is not established to the satisfaction of the board Department of State within sixty-five days from the date of the second published notice, the property will be deemed to be abandoned and shall become the property of the Chennault Aviation and Military Museum of Louisiana.

(3) If no valid claim has been made to the property within sixtyfive days from the date of the second published notice, title to the property shall vest in the Chennault Aviation and Military Museum of Louisiana free from all claims.

§380.116. Use of collections

Any collection of the Chennault Aviation and Military Museum of Louisiana may, subject to approval of the board Department of State, be lent in part. The board Department of State shall ensure proper safeguards for its maintenance and return and shall ensure that proper records are kept. The collections shall be available for use in educational projects, subject to the approval of the board Department of State.
