I. SUMMARY OF JOINT RESOLUTION

This report is for House Bill No. 275 of the 2016 Regular Session by Representative Miller, proposing to adds Article I, Section 10.1 of the Constitution.

HB 275 proposes to amend the constitution to prohibit a person convicted of a felony from qualifying for election or holding an elective office.

II. CONCLUSION

The proposed measure cannot be accomplished statutorily.

HB 275 proposes to prohibit convicted felons from holding or qualifying for an elected office. The present constitution, Article I, Section 10, provides for certain limitations on an individual from holding an elected office and qualifying for election for office, and a constitutional amendment is required in order to change these constitutional limitations. However, the Louisiana Supreme Court recently held in Shepherd v. Schedler et al., that Article I, Section 10 was unconstitutional as there was not substantial compliance with the mandatory requirements of La. Const. Art. XIII, §1, in effecting an amendment to the Louisiana Constitution.
